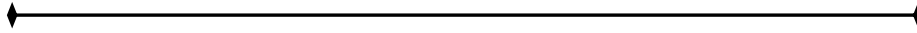

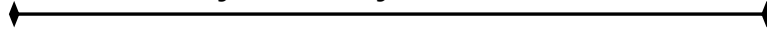

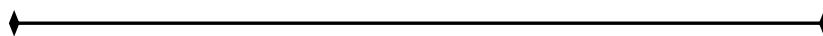

## CHAMBER ORCHESTRA – DR. THOMAS DICKEY

Reviewed by critics as a "dynamic and exciting conductor" whose conducting is "imbued with aplomb, energy, and pathos," Dr. Thomas Taylor Dickey is the Director of Orchestral Studies at Oklahoma State University, where he conducts the OSU Symphony Orchestra and guides all aspects of the orchestra and orchestral conducting programs. He concurrently serves as Music Director & Conductor of the OSU Youth Orchestra and Artistic Advisor of the Stillwater Community Orchestra. Prior to his appointments in Oklahoma, he was the Director of Orchestral Activities at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville and Music Director & Conductor of the Dubuque Symphony Youth Orchestra (IA).



Dr. Dickey has conducted many professional orchestras throughout North America, Europe, and Asia, including the Belgrade Chamber Orchestra in Serbia; Lyatoshinsky Symphony Orchestra in the Ukraine; Shenyang Symphony in China; the Severočeská filharmonie Teplice and Moravská filharmonie Olomouc in the Czech Republic; the Orquestra da Costa Atlântica in Portugal; London Classical Soloists in England; Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra in Canada; and the Philharmonic Orchestra "Mihail Jora" of Bacau, Romania, in addition to the Bakersfield, Macon, Missouri, Norwalk, Rapides, Springfield, and Tulsa symphonies; the Saratoga Orchestra of Whidbey Island; the Smoky Mountain International Chamber Orchestra; Naples Philharmonic; Rose City Chamber Orchestra; and the Chicago Reading Orchestra. He has also worked with numerous all-state, honors, and university orchestras in Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

A native of Illinois, Dr. Dickey holds doctoral and master's degrees in orchestral conducting from the University of Georgia and Louisiana State University, respectively, and graduated with highest honors from Eastern Illinois University. He has worked with conductors such as Carl Topilow, Christopher Zimmerman, Daniel Lewis, Gustav Meier, and Diane Wittry, and further studied conducting in numerous workshops and master classes at the Prague Academy of Performing Arts, Cleveland Institute of Music, and Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, among others.

## SECOND JAZZ BAND – DR. GAIL ROBERTSON

Dr. Gail Robertson earned her B. A. degree from the University of Central Florida and a M.M. in Euphonium Performance from Indiana University while serving as graduate assistant to Harvey Phillips. She postponed her doctoral studies at the University of Maryland with Dr. Brian Bowman to perform with the "Tubafours" at Walt Disney World, Orlando where she served as musical supervisor/chief arranger and produced a highly acclaimed CD, "*Tubas Under the Boardwalk*." She has recently completed her D.M.A. as a University Distinguished Fellow at Michigan State University studying with Phil Sinder, Ava Ordman, and Ricardo Lorenz. She has taught on the faculties of Eastern Michigan University, the University of Central Florida, Bethune-Cookman University, the University of Florida, Valencia, and Seminole Community Colleges, and remains active as a teacher, adjudicator, composer, arranger and free-lance artist, both nationally and internationally.



Robertson currently serves as Visiting Assistant Professor of Tuba and Euphonium/Jazz at the University of Central Arkansas where she is tubist in the Pinnacle Brass and teaches the Jazz Ensemble II. She is the Chair/Chief Editor of the International Tuba and Euphonium Press, and serves on the Board of Directors of the Leonard Falcone Tuba and Euphonium Festival, the International Tuba and Euphonium Association (ITEA), and the International Women's Brass Conference (IWBC). She has served as President of the IWBC and as a conference host in 2010 and 2006. She has also served as Euphonium and Membership Coordinator of the International Tuba and Euphonium Association (ITEA) and was the featured artist on the cover of the *ITEA Journal* (Vol. 38:1, Fall 2010). Two of Gail's original works have also been featured Gems in the *ITEA Journal* (*Jazz Encounter No. 1 - Gem Series No. 22*, Vol. 38:1, Fall 2010, and *Allegro et Andantango - Gem Series No. 33*, Vol. 41:3, Spring 2014).

Gail was recently awarded the 2014 Clifford Bevan Award for Excellence in Research for her document, "Restoring the Euphonium's Legacy as Cello of the Wind Band." Her original work for brass quintet, *Tower Guard Tribute*, was awarded honorable mention by the 2014 International Alliance for Women in Music's Patsy Lu competition. In May 2009, Gail recorded a new CD with Dr. Stacy Baker, Alex Thio, and Dr. Deb Eastwood, called "*SymbiosisDuo*." SYMBIOSISDUO released their second CD, "*Playground*," in February 2015. Several of the works recorded by the duo were newly commissioned works written especially for the duo. Composers include: Franz Cibulka, Jim Self, James Grant, Christopher Marshall, Brian Balmages, Chris Sharp, Kimberly Archer, T.O. Sterrett, and Phillip Bimstein. In 2007, Gail received Tau Beta Sigma's highest honor, the "*Outstanding Service to Music Award*." She has also been a clinician for the MIDWEST Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, the Florida Music Educators' Association, the Michigan Music Conference, and numerous ITEA, IWBC, and United States Army Tuba and Euphonium Conferences.

Dr. Gail Robertson served together with Dr. Stacy Baker as Co-Instrumental Advisor and Co-Curriculum Designer for the Pro-Series Elite Practice Systems for Tuba and Euphonium providing all exercises, instruction, and quartet arrangements as well as performing as on-screen talent alongside

some of their students for the revolutionary pedagogical series of 10 DVDs for tuba and 10 DVD's for euphonium. The project was fully funded and released by American Product Group, LLC in 2013 along with similar series for each of the wind instruments.

Robertson has toured the U.S., Europe, China, and Japan with Keith Brion's "New Sousa Band," the Brass Band of Battle Creek, the Monarch Brass, the Athena Brass Band, and the Brass Band of Central Florida. She has also performed with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the Ann Arbor Symphony, the River City Brass Band, Jack Daniel's Silver Cornet Band, Euphoniums Unlimited, Symphonia, the Orlando based "Horns and Pipes" Brass and Percussion Ensemble, and SYMBIOSISDUO. Her published works and arrangements are available through GAR MUSIC, Euphonium.com, and Tuba-Euphonium Press. As a Willson Euphonium Artist, Robertson's euphonium of choice is a Willson 2950TA with a bronze Warburton/Gail Robertson mouthpiece.

#### FIRST JAZZ BAND – ROBERT M. WATSON



A GRAMMY®-nominated saxophonist, composer, producer and educator, Bobby Watson trained formally at the University of Miami and then earned his doctorate as musical director of Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers, the ultimate postgraduate school for ambitious young players. Along the way, he worked with notable jazz artists Max Roach, Louis Hayes, George Coleman, Sam Rivers and Branford and Wynton Marsalis as well as vocalists Joe Williams, Dianne Reeves, Lou Rawls, Betty Carter and Carmen Lundy.

Later, in association with bassist Curtis Lundy and drummer Victor Lewis, Watson launched the first edition of Horizon, the highly acclaimed acoustic quintet. He has also led the High Court of Swing (a tribute to the music of Johnny Hodges), The Tailor-Made Big Band and is a founding member of the highly acclaimed 29th Street Saxophone Quartet. Watson also wrote original music for the sound track of Robert DeNiro's directorial debut, *A Bronx Tale*. To date, Watson has recorded over 26 records as a leader and appears on more than 80 additional recordings.

More than 100 of his compositions have been recorded. Additionally, Second Floor Music, his long-time publisher, makes his original combo and big band arrangements available for other performers and educators. After a string of recordings for the Palmetto label, Watson released a pair of self-produced titles. The Gates BBQ Suite celebrates his

hometown's most famous food and the one-time family business, and serves as a vehicle for the University of Missouri-Kansas City jazz students, who participate in the school's Watson-directed program. Watson's most recent release, Check Cashing Day, celebrates the Civil Rights Movement in general and more specifically, the 50th Anniversary of Martin Luther King's famed *I Have A Dream* speech. In 2000, at UMKC's administration invitation, Watson returned to Kansas City where he was awarded the position of first William and Mary Grant Missouri Professor of Jazz as an endowed chair. The position encompasses Watson's directorship of the conservatory's aforementioned Jazz Studies Program.

Of late, Watson has received a number of well-deserved awards recognizing his musical contributions during what is now a four-decade career. In 2011, Watson was inducted into the Kansas Music Hall of Fame. In 2013, he received the prestigious Benny Golson Jazz Masters Award from Howard University in Washington, D.C. Simultaneously, Rep. John Conyers honored Watson by officially recognizing his work in the *Congressional Record*. A recent acknowledgment of his commitment to the field is perhaps the sweetest yet. On August 23, 2014, coincidentally his 61st birthday, Watson was selected to be among the first inductees into the newly established 18th and Vine "Jazz Walk of Fame." He joined Pat Metheny as the only other living selection along with four of the city's jazz icons: Count Basie, Jay McShann, Charlie Parker and Mary Lou Williams.

#### TENOR BASS CHOIR – DR. PATRICK GARDNER



Patrick Gardner's performances have been acclaimed by New York audiences, critics, and an international roster of composers including William Bolcom, John Harbison, Lou Harrison, Jennifer Higdon, Tarik O'Regan, and Lukas Foss. The performance of major works by Lou Harrison he curated and conducted at Trinity Wall Street NYC was named in the New York Times list of "Best Classical Performances of 2017." Now in his 29th season as director of the Riverside Choral Society (RCS), Mr. Gardner is also the Director of Choral Activities at Rutgers University's Mason Gross School of the Arts, where he conducts the Rutgers University Kirkpatrick Choir and the Rutgers University Glee Club and directs the graduate program in choral conducting. Dr. Gardner teaches the graduate choral literature course at Westminster Choir College as a visiting professor. The Rutgers University Glee Club appeared at the most recent ACDA national convention in Minneapolis, marking the ninth time Dr. Gardner's groups have been chosen to appear at a divisional or national convention of ACDA. The Rutgers University Kirkpatrick Choir has been chosen to perform at the Marktoberdorf Choral Competition in Germany this summer.

Deeply committed to education, Dr. Gardner is in demand as a clinician and has conducted All-State and honors choirs in New Jersey, Texas, Michigan, Illinois, Ohio, Connecticut, Alabama, and Oklahoma as well as the New England Music Festival Choir. Dr. Gardner has four times presented master classes for conductors in Taiwan and in 2007 presented master-classes for professional conductors in the Netherlands for NOVK, Nederlandse Organisatie Voor Koördirigenten. He will lead a master-class for conductors in Saarbrücken, Germany this June.

Dr. Gardner has conducted nearly 100 major works with orchestra since his arrival in New York in 1990, from Mozart's Requiem and the Bach B Minor Mass at Carnegie Hall, to Stravinsky's Cantata at Symphony Space. He has conducted RCS in its Lincoln Center performances of Beethoven's Missa Solemnis, the Verdi and Brahms Requiems, Stravinsky's Symphony of Psalms, Mozart's C-minor Mass, and Lou Harrison's La Koro Sutro. He prepared the Rutgers University Glee Club for a performance of Schoenberg's Gurrelieder with The Philadelphia Orchestra conducted by Sir Simon Rattle, and was chorus master for the internationally acclaimed Robert Altman production of Stravinsky's "The Rake's Progress" at the Opéra de Lille in France. Mr. Gardner has recorded for the Naxos, Affetto, Albany, Ethereal, and Folkways labels.

### TREBLE CHOIR – DR. JEFFREY REDDING

Jeffery Redding, Director of Choral Activities at West Orange High School in Winter Garden, Florida, has led his choirs in performances at state, regional, and national conventions of the American Choral Directors' Association (ACDA). West Orange choirs have earned first place awards at Heritage Festivals of Gold in California, Chicago, New York and at the Festival of Spirituals in Washington, D.C. While participating in the International Music Festival in Verona, Italy, West Orange received the Gold Award for best choir, with Dr. Redding honored as top director.



Dr. Redding is in demand as a guest conductor and lecturer. He has conducted the ACDA National High School Honor Choir, the Central Division ACDA Honor Choir, the North Central Division ACDA Honor Choir, the Eastern Division ACDA Honor Choir and All-State and Honor choirs in Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Minnesota, Mississippi, Montana, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

Internationally, in 2014 and 2016 he was the only American adjudicator at the International Choral Festival, in Verona, Italy. He served as Guest Conductor at the TAISM Festival of Choirs in Muscat, Oman in 2017. In 2018, he was chosen as the Artistic Director for the Limerick Sings International Choral Festival. He is regularly chosen as one of the guest conductors for Disney World's Candlelight Processional at Epcot. He is also a finalist for the 2019 Grammy Award in Music Education.

Previously Director of Choral Activities at West Virginia University, Dr. Redding has been featured as guest conductor at Carnegie Hall, Alice Tully Hall, Kennedy Center, and Orchestra Hall on numerous occasions. He was also honored to give the prestigious TEDx Talk. Recognized for his achievements and service in the profession, Dr. Redding was awarded the R. Wayne Hugoboom Distinguished Service Award for "dedicated service, leadership, and excellence" by the Florida Chapter of ACDA in November 2015.

Dr. Redding is founder and Artistic Director of the Garden Community Choir and a professional chamber choir Voci del Cuore in Winter Garden, Florida. Formerly with the Moses Hogan Singers, he remains active as a singer in the professional male singing group, "Brethren." The *Jeffery Redding Passion and Purpose Choral Series* is a compilation of new choral music by various composers, published by Colla Voce Music, LLC.

Dr. Redding holds a Ph.D. in Choral Conducting/Music Education and a Master's in Music Education, both from the Florida State University, and a B.S. in Music Education from Florida A&M University. He is a member of ACDA, NAFME, FVA, NATS, and Chorus America. In the Florida Vocal Association (FVA) he has served as District 8 Chairperson. In the Florida ACDA, he has served as State R&R Chair for Ethnic Music/Multicultural Affairs, Co-Chair for the High School Mixed Honor Choir, and Chair of Youth/Student Activities. Currently, he is the State R&R Chair for High School Mixed Choir for Florida ACDA.

### MIXED CHOIR – DR. ANDRÉ J. THOMAS

André J. Thomas, the Owen F. Sellers Professor of Music, is Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Choral Music Education at Florida State University. A previous faculty member at the University of Texas, Austin, Dr. Thomas received his degrees from Friends University (B.A.), Northwestern University (M. M.), and the University of Illinois (D.M.A.). He is in demand as a choral adjudicator, clinician, and director of Honor/All-State Choirs throughout North America, Europe, Asia, New Zealand, Australia, and Africa



Dr. Thomas has conducted choirs at the state, division, and national conventions of the Music Educators National Conference (NAFME) and American Choral Directors Association (ACDA). His international conducting credits are extensive. They include conductor/clinician for the International Federation of Choral Musicians' summer residency of the World Youth Choir in the The Republic of China and the Philippines. He was also the conductor of the winter residency of the World Youth Choir in Europe and a premier performance by an American Choir (Florida State University Singers) in Vietnam. He has been the guest conductor of such distinguished orchestras and choirs as the Birmingham Symphony Orchestra in England, guest Conductor for the Berlin Radio Choir and the North German Radio Choir in Germany, the Netherlands Radio Choir, The Bulgarian Radio Choir

and Orchestra, the Charlotte Symphony, Tallahassee Symphony, China's People's Liberation Orchestra and the Czech National Symphony Orchestra. Since 1988, he has also served as Artistic Director of the Tallahassee Community Chorus. Thomas has also distinguished himself as a composer/arranger. Hinshaw Music Company, Mark Foster Music Company, Fitzsimons Music Company, Lawson Gould, Earthsongs, Choristers Guild, and Heritage Music Company publishes his compositions and arrangements. Dr. Thomas has produced two instructional videos "What They See Is What You Get" on choral conducting, with Rodney Eichenberger, and "Body, Mind, Spirit, Voice" on adolescent voices, with Anton Armstrong. His recent book "Way Over in Beulah Lan". Understanding and Performing the Negro Spiritual" has quickly become a major source in this area of study. Thomas has been recognized by various musical organizations. The African Diaspora Sacred Music honored Dr. Thomas as a Living Legend. In 2011, Thomas' dedication to and accomplishments in the choral arts were recognized by his peers in Chorus America when that the organization presented Dr. Thomas with its Distinguished Service Award. In March of 2017, ACDA presented Thomas with its highest honor the Robert Shaw Award, and finally in November of 2017 NCCO (National Collegiate Choral Organization) presented Thomas with its Lifetime Achievement Award. He is a past president of the Florida ACDA and the past president of the Southern Division of ACDA, and the current President Elect of National ACDA.

## ORCHESTRA – STEPHEN M. HEYDE



In addition to his responsibilities as Music Director/ Conductor of the Waco Symphony, Stephen Heyde is the Mary Franks Thompson Professor of Orchestral Studies and Conductor-in-Residence at Baylor University. Before assuming his duties at Baylor in 1984, Mr. Heyde was on the violin faculty at West Virginia University from 1975-1984. Stephen Heyde is a co-founder of the College Orchestra Directors Association and served as President of the organization from 2006-08. He also serves on the Board of Directors of ProMus International, headquartered at Silver Lake College in Manitowoc, Wisconsin. ProMus is a multi-national organization dedicated to promoting the power of music for all people in all circumstances. Mr. Heyde has conducted All State Orchestras and other festival orchestras in numerous states around the country. He has conducted ballet performances with several regional companies and many collegiate opera productions. He is a frequent evaluator of collegiate orchestral programs and conductors and has guest conducted at a number of universities, including Yale University, Ithaca College and the University of Oregon and Brigham Young University most recently.

Stephen Heyde made his European debut with the Krakow State Philharmonic in March 1998. In October, 2004, he was invited to conduct the orchestra of the prestigious Liszt Academy in Budapest, Hungary. During his month long stay in Budapest, he was awarded the prestigious “Memorial Ring of the Liszt Ferenc Music Academy” and also accepted a position on the Curatorium (Board of Supervisors) for the Academy. While in Europe, Mr. Heyde also addressed the International Society for Music Education in Belgium and participated in a Roundtable presentation of the International Kodaly Society. In April, 2007, Mr. Heyde was privileged to return to Belgium as a member of the ensemble jury for the 55th European Music Festival for Young People held in Neerpelt, serving again in April 2011 for the 57th edition of the Festival. In March, 2009, he participated in the American Arts Festival in Flanders, conducting three Belgium orchestras. In July of 2015, he conducted the Córdoba Symphony Orchestra in Argentina. Stephen Heyde has collaborated as conductor with many of the greatest artists of our time, including Yo-Yo Ma, Itzhak Perlman, Joshua Bell, André Watts, Pinchas Zuckerman, Renee Fleming, Aaron Rosand, Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg, Emmanuel Ax, André-Michel Schub, Barry Tuckwell, Christopher Parkening, Ann Akiko Meyers, Edgar Meyer, Jr., Jon Nakamatsu, Cecile Licad, Glenn Dicterow, Midori, Christian Lindberg, Olga Kern, and Denyse Graves among many others and popular artists like Doc Severinsen, Henry Mancini, Burt Bacharach, Art Garfunkle, Al Jarreau and Frank Sinatra, Jr. among many others.

Under Mr. Heyde’s direction, the Baylor Symphony has performed eight times at the Texas Music Educators Clinic/Convention. In December of 2003, the Baylor Symphony was featured with other School of Music ensembles in a PBS Special, “Christmas at Baylor” that was aired nationally in over 350 markets with an estimated audience in excess of six million viewers. The Baylor Symphony has also appeared by invitation at the prestigious Piccolo Spoleto Festival in Charleston, South Carolina, and at national conventions of the American String Teachers Association and the College Orchestra Directors Association. The Baylor Symphony was privileged to accompany the last public performance of revered violinist Joseph Gingold and has also worked with a number of distinguished American performers and composers like Robert Shaw, William Kraft, Jacob Druckman, and Lorin Hollander. Mr. Heyde led the Symphony in concerts in San José, Heredia and Cartago, Costa Rica in March, 2004. In November, 2010, he led the Baylor Chamber Orchestra on a concert tour of Flanders, with performances in Antwerp, Ostend, Louvain and Tongeren. The Baylor Symphony received national recognition again in 2018 by winning the American Prize for an unprecedented fourth consecutive year.

A recipient of Outstanding Teacher Awards at West Virginia University and Baylor University, Mr. Heyde received the Lifetime Achievement Award of the College Orchestra Directors Association in January, 2018. He is a member of the International Kodály Society, Pi Kappa Lambda, Mu Omicron, Texas Music Educators Association and Texas Orchestra Directors Association, in addition to other professional associations.

As a violinist, Mr. Heyde served as concertmaster of the West Virginia Symphonette, concertmaster of the Conductors Guild Orchestra, and associate concertmaster of the New Pittsburgh Chamber Orchestra, among other positions. As a member of the Amart String Quartet and as a recitalist, he appeared frequently on public radio and television. Mr. Heyde is the co-author of the West Virginia Curriculum Guide for Orchestras and Strings, and founder and host of the Ten-a-Day String Series, an educational videotape/DVD series presently in use in over 40 states. He has been a frequent clinician on string and conducting topics around the country.

## CONCERT BAND – DR. RYAN KELLY



Ryan Kelly serves as Assistant Director of Bands and Interim Director of Orchestras at The University of Texas at Austin. His current teaching responsibilities include conducting the Symphony Orchestra, supervising the University Orchestra, teaching graduate conducting, and assisting with all aspects of the university’s band program in the Butler School of Music. Dr. Kelly also serves as faculty sponsor for the Alpha Tau chapter of Kappa Kappa Psi, and as Director of Longhorn Music Camp, managing the university’s annual summer music program serving over 1,100 students from across the country. Previously, Dr. Kelly was Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands at the University of Central Florida, where he served as Director of the Marching Knights, conducted the Symphonic Band, and taught courses in music education.

In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Dr. Kelly maintains an active schedule as a clinician/conductor, adjudicator, and arranger. He conducts honor bands throughout the United States, and in the summer teaches on the faculty of the World Youth Wind Orchestra Project/World Adult Wind Orchestra Project as part of the Mid-Europe Festival in Schladming, Austria. Dr. Kelly is an advocate for new music, and frequently collaborates with composers to produce performances of new and emerging works for band and orchestra. Most notably, he has collaborated with Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Kevin Puts and Grammy-nominated composer Adam Schoenberg to transcribe, premiere, and publish their music for wind ensemble. Additionally, Dr. Kelly has presented at the state music conferences of Texas, Florida, and Ohio, and the biennial national conference of the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA). He has published articles in *Research Perspectives in Music Education*, *Florida Music Director*, and *Southwestern Musician*.



A native of northern Virginia, Dr. Kelly received his bachelor's and master's degrees in music education from Florida State University, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. Before teaching at the university level, Dr. Kelly was a high school band director for seven years in Lakeland and Tallahassee, Florida. During that time, ensembles under his direction were invited to perform at the Music for All National Concert Band Festival, and the JanFest High School Band Festival at the University of Georgia.

Dr. Kelly is a past chair of the Social Media committee for CBDNA, and has previously served on the Board of Directors for the Florida Music Educators Association. In addition to CBDNA, his professional affiliations include the Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, Big 12 Band Directors Association, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma and BMI.

#### **SYMPHONIC BAND – DR. RICHARD C. CRAIN**

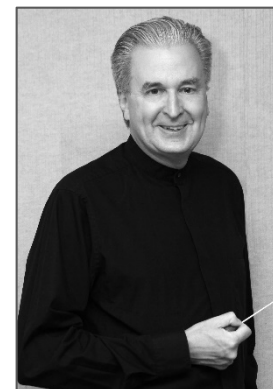
Dr. Richard C. Crain retired in 2000 after 44 years in public school music education. He is presently serving as President of the Board of Directors of The Midwest Clinic. Crain graduated from Charlotte High School in 1952 and attended Trinity University in San Antonio. Dr. Crain was band director in Mercedes, Belton, Spring and Westfield High Schools in Texas. In 1982, he became Director of Music Programs for the Spring Independent School District near Houston. Bands under his direction won awards with performances in Colorado, California, Louisiana, Florida and Virginia. The Belton High School Band performed in the Tournament of Roses Parade in 1974, and in 1980, the Spring High School Band performed at The Midwest Clinic in Chicago, Illinois. During his tenure in Spring ISD the band programs won numerous awards statewide and nationally.



Crain is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, served 32 years as Executive Secretary of Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity, is a past president of the Texas Bandmasters Association, is a member of both the Texas Bandmasters Hall of Fame and the Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Hall of Fame. He is an Honorary Life Member of the Texas Bandmasters Association. He and his wife Gayle served as coordinators of the National Concert Band Festival for 17 years, and, in 2005, were inducted into the Music for All/Bands of America Hall of Fame. In May of 2017, he received the Honorary Doctorate Degree from VanderCook College of Music in Chicago, Illinois. Dr. Crain lives in The Woodlands, Texas, and serves as a deacon at Spring Baptist Church. His three sons and six grand children reside in the greater Houston area.

#### **WIND SYMPHONY – DR. JOSEPH P. MISSAL**

Joseph Missal is celebrating his 32nd year as Director of Bands and Professor of Conducting at Oklahoma State University. In this capacity, he conducts the Wind Ensemble and Chamber Winds and guides all aspects of the OSU Band Program. Dr. Missal also directs the graduate conducting program, teaches undergraduate conducting, and serves as Coordinator for Wind and Percussion Studies. He holds a Bachelor of Music in Instrumental Music Education from Michigan State University, a Master of Music in Wind Conducting from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Wind Conducting from the University of Colorado.



His ensembles have performed for conventions of the Japan Band Clinic (Hamamatsu City, Japan, 2013, 2006), British Association of Symphonic Band and Wind Ensembles (Manchester, England, 2003), World Association for Symphonic Bands (San Luis Obispo, California, 1999, Schladming, Austria 1997), the College Band Directors National Association (National Convention, Kansas City, Missouri 2017, Austin, Texas 2009, Denton, Texas 2001, Boulder, Colorado 1995), National Band Association, the Sonneck Society, Kappa Kappa Psi/Tau Beta Sigma, Oklahoma Music Educators Association, the Percussive Arts Society, and the Western States Collegiate Wind Band Festival. He has received praise from composers David Maslanka, Karel Husa, Cindy McTee, Peter Van Zandt Lane, David Gillingham, Joel Puckett, Paul Dooley, Steven Bryant, Scott McAllister, Michael Daugherty, Frank Ticheli, Shafer Mahoney, Kathryn Salfelder, James Kazik, Roshanne Etezady, Donald Grantham, Dan Welcher, John Mackey, Dana Wilson and others for his expressive interpretations of their music. Former conducting students now hold high school, college, and professional conducting positions throughout the United States.

A member of CBDNA, WASBE, MENC, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma, Pi Kappa Lambda, Phi Beta Mu, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, he has appeared as a guest conductor throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Japan, and Israel. His writing has been published in the *CBDNA Journal*, the *Canadian Band Journal*, and the *GIA Teaching Music through Performance in Band*. Dr. Missal has served as Co-Chairman of the International Wind Band Education Committee for WASBE and is a past President of the Southwest Division of the College Band Directors National Association and the Big Twelve Band Directors Association. He has received the Wise-Diggs-Berry Award for Teaching Excellence in the Arts at Oklahoma State University and was also selected a Distinguished Music Professor. Dr. Missal has also served as a guest conductor for the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic, the International Trombone Association, and the United States Army Field Band. He is an elected member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association and was awarded the Distinguished Service to Music Medal for Concert Band from the National Council of Kappa Kappa Psi.

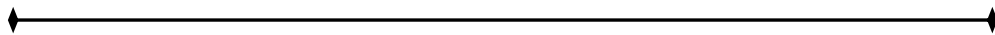
