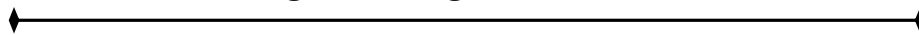

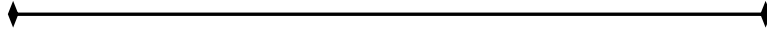

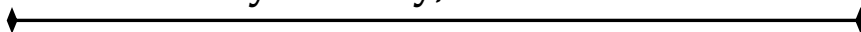

SECOND JAZZ BAND - DR. OLLIE LIDDELL

Dr. Liddell received his Bachelor of Science degree from Jackson State University and his Master of Music Degree and his PhD in Music Education from the University of Mississippi. After stints teaching in Mississippi and at East High School in Memphis, TN, Dr. Liddell took over the responsibilities of Director of Bands at Memphis Central High School. At Central, Dr. Liddell has transformed the band program including recognitions such as being featured on the 2018 fall season of the Lifetime Network series "Bring It;" being a four-time finalist at the Savannah Swing Central Jazz National High School Jazz Band Competition-winning 1st place and the Faircloth Award in 2019; winning the designation of Grand National Champion at the 2017 and 2018 National High Stepping Show Band Competition; 2nd in the Inaugural US Bands STATS National Championship in 2023; selected as performer for the Tennessee Music Educators Conference in 2022; selected as performer for the Jazz Education Network Conference in 2023; named finalist for the 2020 and 2021 Essentially Ellington High School Jazz Band Competition in New York, NY; dozens of students named to the All-West Tennessee Band and Tennessee All-State Band; and consistently receiving Superior Ratings in Concert Band, Wind Ensembles, Jazz Festivals, and Marching Contests.

Dr. Liddell is an active musician (Trombone), arranger, adjudicator, and clinician for music education and serves as a mentor to young band directors in Memphis/Shelby County. FIRST JAZZ BAND - DR. JOSEPH JEFFERSON



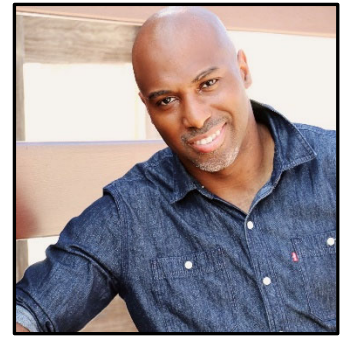
Dr. Joseph L. Jefferson is an award-winning educator that currently serves as Associate Professor of Music and Director of Jazz Ensembles/Applied Jazz Trombone at St. Olaf College. Trained in both classical and jazz traditions, Joseph is a versatile and well-rounded musician that performs as a soloist, and chamber musician in symphonic, jazz, and commercial musical settings both nationally and internationally. Joseph's honors and awards range across the scholastic and musical spectrum. Recently, Joseph was selected as 1 of 40 music educators throughout the country to be featured in the "Yamaha 40 under 40" Class of 2023. He has also been awarded the 2022 Ellis Marsalis, Jr. Jazz Educator of the Year by the Jazz Education Network.

As a performer, Dr. Jefferson has shared the stage with a variety of groups and artists such as Vanessa Williams, Jennifer Wharton, Sean Jones, Andre Hayward, John Fedchock, The Colour of Music Orchestra, Paducah Symphony, The Irish Tenors, The Cab Calloway Orchestra, Zoltan Kiss (Mnozil Brass), Randy Brecker, Jae Sinnett, Mike Berkowitz, Christopher Bill, and international R&B artists Dwele and Raheem Devaughn among others. Dr. Jefferson has been an invited guest artist and presenter at the International Trombone Festival, Jazz Education Network Conference, Darkwater Festival, Washington State Music Educators Association Conference, Louisiana Music Educators Association Conference, Jazz Institute of Chicago, NAfME - Eastern Division Conference, International Horn Symposium, Reno Jazz Festival - University of Nevada, Reno, University of Evansville Brass & Percussion Day, Mt. Hood Jazz Festival, Weber State University, and Mineral Area College. Internationally, Dr. Jefferson has also had performing and teaching residencies in Bermuda and Asia at the College of Music, Mahidol University in Nakhon Pathom, Thailand.

Prior to arriving at St. Olaf College, Joseph held faculty positions at Southeast Missouri State University, The University of Portland, and Treasure Valley CC. Dr. Jefferson earned degrees from Norfolk State (B.M.), Shenandoah Conservatory (M.M.), and West Virginia University (D.M.A.) under the tutelage of esteemed faculty; including, Dr. Keith Jackson, Dr. Wayne Wells, Dr. Mike Hall, and Mr. Paul Adams. He has received instruction from Joseph Alessi, Andre Hayward, Amanda Stewart, Vincent Gardner, and Dr. Natalie Mannix. Dr. Jefferson maintains his connection with the larger community of musicians and educators through his membership in Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Jazz Education Network, International Trombone Association, NAfME (Southwestern Jazz Division Representative), Texas Music Educators Association, National Advisory Board Member - "One City" - VanderCook College of Music (Outreach Program), and the Jazz Content Editor for the Historical Brass Society. Additionally, Dr. Jefferson regularly serves as a clinician/consultant for Jazz at Lincoln Center. Dr. Jefferson is a Yamaha performing artist and plays Yamaha instruments exclusively.

TENOR/BASS CHOIR - REGINAL WRIGHT

Reginal Wright has served over 20 years as a public school teacher. As an educator, he has earned many awards including Outstanding Teacher, Who's Who Among America's Teachers, and the Secondary Educator of the Year Award. Mr. Wright has performed music throughout Europe and the United States. As a conductor, he is sought after as a clinician in both middle school and high school and has enjoyed the opportunity to conduct honor choirs throughout the United States. As a composer, his works have been commissioned by middle school, high school, college, and professional choirs. Mr. Wright's works have been performed by All-State Choirs and invited convention choirs. His "Invictus" was performed at the 2021 ACDA National Convention and by the 2022 Texas All-State Tenor-Bass Choir. His "Where are the Bodies" was performed at Carnegie Hall in collaboration with Dallas-based Turtle Creek Chorale. Reginal's works are published and distributed through BriLee, Carl Fisher, Graphite, Hal Leonard, Oxford University Press, Santa Barbara Music Publishing, and his own publishing company, Reginal Wright Music. Mr. Wright received both his Bachelor and Master of Music Education Degrees from Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas. Most recently, he was the head choral director at Mansfield High School and is currently on the choral music faculty at Baylor University. His choirs consistently earn sweepstakes in concert and sight-reading contests. Choirs under his direction also earn "Outstanding in Class" awards at State and National Music Festivals. The Mansfield High School Varsity Treble Choir was featured as an invited choir for the SW-ACDA Convention in 2012 and 2022 and for the ACDA National Convention in 2023. In 2018, the Mansfield High School Varsity Tenor-Bass Choir was honored as a Texas Music Educators Association Invited Choir. Reginal resides in Arlington, Texas with his wife Renetta, son Gabrien, daughter Reece, and Yorkie Cooper.



TREBLE CHOIR - DR. ERIN PLISCO



Erin Plisco is the Associate Director of Choral Studies at Missouri State University, where she conducts multiple choirs and teaches undergraduate and graduate choral conducting and literature. She is a frequent guest clinician across the United States and abroad, and has presented at state, regional, and national conferences of the American Choral Directors Association. She currently serves as the ACDA National SSAA Repertoire and Resources Chair and was recently a conducting fellow for ACDA's International Conductor Exchange Program. Choirs under her direction recently performed at the 2022 ACDA Southwestern Region Conference, the 2022 Missouri Music Educators Association Conference, the 2023 National ACDA Conference, the 2023 National Collegiate Choral Organization national conference and at Carnegie Hall. She was recently awarded the Podium Award and the Outstanding District Director Award by MCDA for outstanding performances at state and regional conferences.

Dr. Plisco completed the DMA in Choral Conducting from the University of Arizona, where she studied conducting with Bruce Chamberlain and voice with Elizabeth Futral. She also studied at Trinity College, University of Cambridge, where she was a recipient of the prestigious Gates Cambridge Scholarship and worked with Grammy-nominated conductor Stephen Layton. She holds a Bachelor of Music in Choral Music Education and Vocal Performance with a minor in Leadership Studies from Christopher Newport University.

Dr. Plisco has conducted choirs of all ages, most notably serving as Director of Choral Studies at Pinecrest High School (NC). Under her direction, the choirs received numerous awards at national festivals and competitions, and her chamber choir was the winner of The American Prize for high school choral performance. She has also held positions at the University of Arizona, East Carolina University, and Simpson College. Dr. Plisco is a past recipient of the Colleen Kirk Award, given by southern ACDA in recognition of her outstanding achievements as a young conductor, and has spent three summers as a choral fellow with the Yale School of Music -Norfolk Chamber Music Festival in Connecticut under the direction of Simon Carrington.

SATB CHOIR - DR. CAMERON LABARR

Cameron LaBarr is director of choral studies and the Clif and Gail Smart professor in music at Missouri State University. He previously held university choral positions at Lee University (Cleveland, Tennessee) and the University of North Texas. He earned the M.M. and D.M.A. from the University of North Texas where he studied with Jerry McCoy and Richard Sparks. He has completed further study in choral music and conducting with Simon Carrington and Alice Parker. Dr. LaBarr has an international reputation as conductor, clinician, and choral juror across North America, South America, Europe, Africa, and Asia, and serves as board member for the International Federation for Choral Music. Dr. LaBarr's recent engagements include concerts and events in Indonesia, France, Chile, Argentina, South Korea, South Africa, and Spain. Dr. LaBarr curates two choral series with Santa Barbara Music Publishing and Walton Music, where he champions emerging and established composers, and is additionally published by Colla Voce, Choristers Guild, Walton Music, and GIA Publications. Dr. LaBarr is co-author of the book *"The Melodic Voice: Conversations with Alice Parker."*

Choirs under the direction of Dr. LaBarr have been selected for performance at the Tennessee Music Education Association Conference, Tennessee ACDA Conference, Missouri Music Educators Association Conference, Piccolo Spoleto Festival, National Collegiate Choral Organization, National ACDA (2019 and 2023), Southwest ACDA, Intercollegiate Men's Choruses National Seminar, the China International Chorus Festival, the IFCM World Voices Conference, the Tolosa Choral Contest (Basque Country, Spain), and the Jeju International Choral Festival (South Korea). Recently, Dr. LaBarr has been a jury member for the Asia Grand Prix, the Bali International Choral Festival (Indonesia), the China International Choral Festival, and the Tolosa Choral Contest (Basque Country, Spain). Dr. LaBarr has served as artistic director of international choral festivals in the Czech Republic, Italy, France, and Ireland, and has conducted concerts of the MSU Chorale in South Africa (2016 and 2022), Scandinavia (2018), China (2018), Spain (2021), Canada (2023), and across the United States.



ORCHESTRA - DR. MARK LAYCOCK



Dr. Mark Laycock began his career as an instructor of strings and orchestra at the middle and high school levels of the Clark County School District in Las Vegas, Nevada. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Music History and Literature from the University of Southern California, a Master of Music in Instrumental Conducting from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and a Doctor of Arts in Orchestral Conducting from the University of Northern Colorado. Dr. Laycock served as Director of Orchestras and Instrumental Music at Chapman University in Orange, California, was Director of Orchestral Activities at Iowa State University, and Music Director of the Central Iowa Symphony.

Dr. Laycock is a Professor of Music at Wichita State University, where he holds the Ann Walenta Faculty of Distinction Endowed Professorship, and serves as Director of Orchestras and Coordinator of Strings. He has been recognized with the WSU Excellence in Creative Activity

Award and the College of Fine Arts Excellence in Teaching Award. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic and serves as Chair of Orchestra Activities. He is Conductor of the Wichita Youth Symphony and Director of the Wichita Youth Orchestras Program.

His work as guest conductor, clinician, or adjudicator spans 35 states. Recent and upcoming appearances include the Bangkok International String Festival, the Texas Conducting Workshop, the all-state orchestras of California, Nevada, and Wyoming, educational sessions at the Conn-Selmer Institute and The Ohio State University String Teacher Workshop, adjudication in Arizona, California, Colorado, and Indiana, and honor ensembles in Minnesota, Oregon, Texas, and Virginia. Dr. Laycock served the National Orchestra Festival as adjudicator, clinician and, in 2018 and 2019, chair of the event. A frequent visitor to Australia, he was a conductor for the Queensland State Honours Ensemble Program, Chief Adjudicator for the Victorian School Music Festival in Melbourne, served as a keynote presenter for the Australian Strings Association 2018 National Conference in Perth, and was a keynote speaker for the 2021 Australian National Band and Orchestra Conference. Dr. Laycock is a five-time invited music education panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts. His appearances with professional ensembles include the Wichita Symphony Orchestra, Wichita Grand Opera, and Opera Kansas, as well as orchestras in Slovakia and Canada. He is a chapter author for the fourth volume of *Teaching Music through Performance in Orchestra* and a frequent contributor to the *American String Teacher* journal.

CONCERT BAND - DR. ELIZABETH PETERSON

Dr. Elizabeth Peterson, Emeritus Professor, retired from her position as Associate Director of Bands at the University of Illinois School of Music. Dr. Peterson conducted the Illinois Wind Orchestra, served as the placement coordinator for student teachers and taught several courses in instrumental conducting. Prior to her appointment at the University of Illinois, Dr. Peterson was a tenured professor of music education at the Ithaca College School of Music. During the seventeen years she spent at Ithaca College, she conducted numerous ensembles including the Symphonic Band, Brass Choir, and All-Campus Band. She taught courses in conducting, undergraduate and graduate courses in music education, and supervised student teachers. Dr. Peterson was the co-conductor of the Ithaca Concert Band, an adult community band for fifteen years.

Dr. Peterson continues to be active as a guest conductor, adjudicator, and school music consultant. She presents clinics at the local, state and national levels in the field of music education and has published two books: *"The Music Teachers First Year: Tales of Challenge Joy and Triumph,"* and *"The Music Teacher's Later Years: Reflection with Wisdom."*

Dr. Peterson is a graduate of the University of Michigan where she received a Bachelor of Music Education and Bachelor of Arts and studied trumpet with Armando Ghitalla. She received a Master of Music in Music Education and Trumpet Performance from Northwestern University, where she studied trumpet with Vincent Cichowicz. She earned a Doctor of Musical Arts in Music Education from Shenandoah Conservatory. Prior to her appointment at Ithaca College, Dr. Peterson was an arts administrator and director of bands in the public schools of Ohio and Illinois. Dr. Peterson is a member of the American Bandmasters Association and serves on the Board of Directors for the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic.



SYMPHONIC BAND - DR. RYAN KELLY



Ryan Kelly is the inaugural Associate Dean for Academic Affairs and Student Success at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where he is also associate professor of music in wind conducting. In this role, he provides oversight and strategic direction for academic programs and curricular initiatives, student health and wellness, career readiness, and accreditation. Dr. Kelly was previously Associate Director of Bands and Associate Director of the Butler School of Music at The University of Texas at Austin, where he conducted the Wind Symphony and New Music Ensemble, served as Interim Director of Orchestras and as Associate Director of the Longhorn Band, and taught graduate and undergraduate conducting. Before joining the UT faculty, he was Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands at the University of Central Florida, where he served as Director of the Marching Knights, conducted the Symphonic Band, and taught courses in music education.

In summers, Dr. Kelly teaches on the faculty of the World Youth Wind Orchestra Project as part of the Mid-Europe Festival in Schladming, Austria. He has presented at the state music conferences of Texas, Florida, and Ohio, the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA) Biennial National Conference, and the CBDNA Athletic Band Symposium. While residing in Austin, he curated and hosted a weekly radio show on KMFA Classical 89.5, Austin's classical radio station, featuring performances from UT students and faculty.

A native of northern Virginia, Dr. Kelly received bachelor and master degrees in music education from Florida State University, and the Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. Before teaching at the university level, he was a high school band director in Lakeland and Tallahassee, Florida. Dr. Kelly has previously served as Chair of the Social Media Committee for CBDNA, Secretary for the Big 12 Band Directors Association, and was a member of the Board of Directors for the Florida Music Educators Association. His professional affiliations include CBDNA, the College Music Society, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma, and BMI.

WIND SYMPHONY - DR. ROBERT CARNOCHAN

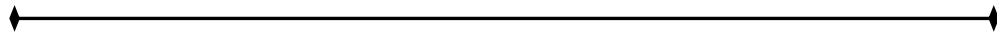
Robert M. Carnochan currently serves the Frost School of Music as Director of Wind Ensemble Activities, Music Director/Conductor of the Frost Wind Ensemble and Professor of Conducting at the University of Miami. In addition to overseeing all aspects of the wind band program, Professor Carnochan also teaches graduate and conducting and wind repertoire. Prior to his appointment at the Frost School of Music, he served as Professor of Music and Director of the Longhorn Band at The University of Texas at Austin for 13 years. Dr. Carnochan has also served as Associate Director of Bands at the University of Colorado at Boulder, Director of Bands at Northeastern Oklahoma State University, and Associate Director of Bands at Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas. Dr. Carnochan began his professional teaching career as Director of Bands at Dundalk High School in Baltimore, Maryland—a position he holds near and dear to his heart.

Through his career, Dr. Carnochan has collaborated with and received praise from a number of established composers including; Andy Akiho, Mason Bates, David Biedenbender, Steven Bryant, Valerie Coleman, Viet Cuong, John Corigliano, Michael Daugherty, Kevin Day, Paul Dooley, Donald Grantham, Jennifer Jolley, Jonathan Leshnoff, John Mackey, David Maslanka, James Mobberly, Carter Pann, Joel Puckett, Carlos Simon, Gunther Schuller, Joseph Schwantner, Omar Thomas, Frank Ticheli, and Xi Wang. Dr. Carnochan is active as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator throughout the United States, and has conducted concerts in London, Spain, Austria, Luxembourg, Switzerland and Singapore.

He has served as producer for several acclaimed recordings by both The University of Texas Wind Ensemble and the Dallas Winds and his own recording of Donald Grantham's Tuba Concerto, with soloist Charles Villarrubia and the UT Wind Ensemble. Future recording projects include two works by Mason Bates; Sideman and Bootleggers Break, Andy Akiho's Ondine's Epilogue, Lili Boulanger's D'un Soir Triste (Of a Sad Evening) and the epic, cross genre work, Passages by composer Will Healy and lyricist, Spiritchild.

Professionally, Dr. Carnochan maintains memberships in the College Band Directors National Association, and has been inducted into the Alpha Chapter of Phi Beta Mu, as well as the American Bandmasters Association. He is the recipient of numerous service and teaching awards including The Eyes of Texas Award, The Texas Blazers award, the DeCloux Fellowship and the Marinus Smith Award.

His degrees include a Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education from Towson University, a Master of Music degree in Wind Conducting from The University of Colorado at Boulder, and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Wind Conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. His primary conducting teachers include Allan McMurray, Jerry Junkin, and Dana Rothlisberger.
