



BILL BRENT



William E. (Bill) Brent is Director Emeritus of the Dear School of Creative and Performing Arts at Northwestern State University of Louisiana and currently serves as the Executive Secretary of the Louisiana Music Adjudicators Association. He retired after 27 years of serving as the director of the Dear School in 2015, and during and prior to that period, he also served as Director of Bands for 30 years. During his tenure, the band program grew from 48 members to more than 300. With his leadership, the School of Creative and Performing Arts was endowed with more than \$2.5 million in private scholarship funds and \$4 million in grants. In addition, all academic programs in the School of CAPA were accredited by their national accrediting agencies, and the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System designated the School as an "Area of Excellence".

Prior to coming to Northwestern, Mr. Brent was the Director of Bands at McCallum High School in Austin, Texas, where the marching band was twice named in the top five in the University Interscholastic League "State Marching Contest" and the symphonic band was named in the top ten in the Texas Music Educators' Association "Honor Band" competition. Mr. Brent holds the Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees from the

University of Texas, Austin. Among his professional organization memberships are the Louisiana Music Educators Association, Music Educators National Conference, Texas Music Educators Association, the Texas Bandmasters Association, the College Band Directors National Association and Phi Beta Mu. The National Council of Kappa Kappa Psi honored Mr. Brent with the A. Frank Martin Award in 1997 and in 2002, Mr. Brent received the highest honor bestowed by the University to members of the faculty when he was presented with the Northwestern "Distinguished Service Award". In 2007, Mr. Brent was inducted into the Louisiana Music Educators Association "Hall of Fame" and in 2011, he was inducted into the Louisiana Music "Hall of Fame". In 2012, he was elected to membership in the prestigious "American Bandmaster's Association".

PHIL LAROCQUE

Phil LaRocque grew up in El Paso, Texas, starting his musical journey on Trombone in the 6th grade. In 8th grade, he joined the full orchestra at school making the All-City Orchestra under Maestro Chavez as a freshman. Phil continued playing in band and orchestra through college, subbing at times in the Amarillo Symphony and performing in numerous ensembles. He even played for several headliners like Bob Hope, the Smothers Brothers, and The Barnum and Bailey Circus.

He became a band director in 1983 in Borger, Texas, under his mentor Roger Edwards. In 2000 he moved to the Dallas area teaching at The Colony High School and Irving High School. In 2006 Mr. LaRocque moved to teach Orchestra at Lakeview Middle School in The Colony, Texas, consistently earning sweepstakes at UIL competitions and won outstanding Orchestra at several Peak music festivals. He was the Region 1 band chair from 1999-2000, 4A All-State Band organizer in 2000, and co-organizer of the All-State Symphony orchestra in 2012. He is a member of the Phi Beta Mu Band Fraternity.

After 35 and a half years Phil retired from teaching in schools as a Band and Orchestra director. Currently, he is keeping a busy schedule running a recording business, judging contests, being a clinician, and teaching private lessons. He continues to perform with the Plano community band and the New Life Symphony Orchestra. In his spare time, Phil helps his wife in their jewelry business and plays with their 8 grandkids while trying to keep up with the sheep and horses on their small farm.

JEFF TURNER



Jeff Turner has been the Director of Fine Arts for the Allen Independent School District since April 2015. Prior to his appointment in Allen ISD, he served as the Instrumental Music Coordinator for the Plano Independent School District for eight years. He taught orchestra for 16 years before moving into administration serving as the director of orchestras at Plano Senior High School, Vines High School Orchestras, and Williams High School Orchestra. Mr. Turner earned a Bachelor of Music Education from New Mexico State University in 1991 and a Master of Secondary Education from the University of North Texas in 2002. Before moving to Texas, Mr. Turner taught orchestra in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

The Plano Senior High Orchestra was a consistent finalist in TMEA honor orchestra competition (string and full) every year under his direction. The Plano Senior High Symphony Orchestra was invited to perform at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic in 2003 and was named the 2007 Texas Music Educators Association High School Honor Full Orchestra. Mr. Turner is Past President of the Texas Music Adjudicators Association. He has also served as the Executive Secretary for the Texas Music Administrators Conference,

Texas Music Educators Association Orchestra Division Vice President, secretary for the Southwest District of the New Mexico Music Educators Association, President Elect for the NM chapter of ASTA, and elected Vice President for Orchestra for the NMMEA. Mr. Turner holds memberships in Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Music Adjudicators Association, Texas Fine Arts Administrators, Texas Orchestra Directors Association, Mu Omicron and is listed in Who's Who Among America's Teachers. He has also taught summer camps at Texas Tech, Baylor, New Mexico State, and Hummingbird (NM) as well as a chamber coach for The Institute for Strings at SMU.

Mr. Turner lives in Plano with his wife, who is also an educator, and their two boys. He is an active all-region clinician and adjudicator in Texas and NM and has conducted All-State orchestras in New Mexico and Kentucky. Mr. Turner is also the conductor/concertmaster of the orchestra at Hunters Glen Baptist Church in Plano and performs with various professional groups in the Dallas area. In his free time, Mr. Turner enjoys chasing/losing golf balls on the golf course and working on woodworking projects in his shop.



He has been in education as a teacher and administrator for 29 years. As a band director, Dr. Burke taught high school band in the Pasadena Independent School district, and his band was a consistently award-winning program at the state and national levels. Dr. Burke is a frequent clinician for organizations at the state and national levels. Dr. Burke holds degrees from the University of Houston, the University of Houston-Clear Lake, and Kent State University. He resides in Dickinson, Texas, with his wife JoAnn, an elementary music teacher, and his children Liam and Lexi.

JACKIE DIGBY

Jackie Digby is the Director of Bands at Plano West Senior High School and serves as the cluster leader for the Plano West Cluster Bands. Before joining Plano West, Mr. Digby was the Director of Bands at Jasper High School in Plano ISD. His teaching experience also includes roles at Rice Middle School in Plano, as well as Bryant Middle School and Bryant High School in Bryant, Arkansas. Under his leadership, his bands have consistently earned UIL Sweepstakes and have been named "Most Outstanding Ensemble" at numerous festivals. Notably, his bands have earned multiple wins in the National Wind Band Honors competition.

In 2014, the Jasper High School Full Orchestra, co-directed by Mr. Digby, became the first and only non-varsity ensemble to be named the TMEA 6A Honor Full Orchestra. In 2023, the Plano West Symphony Orchestra earned the distinction of TMEA 6A Honor Full Orchestra.

Mr. Digby is a lifetime member of the Texas PTA and was honored as the 2016 Jasper High School Teacher of the Year. He earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree from Henderson State University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, and is a multi-year honoree of *Who's Who Among America's Teachers*. His professional affiliations include the Texas Music Educators Association, Texas

Bandmasters Association, and Phi Beta Mu International School Bandmasters Fraternity. Mr. Digby resides in Frisco with his wife, Maleece, and their son, Jaxon.



ELVA KAY LANCE



Elva Kaye Lance is Director of Bands at Mississippi State University. Her current responsibilities include conducting the Wind Ensemble, providing leadership for the Famous Maroon Band, and administering all aspects of the band program. Ms. Lance also teaches conducting and methods classes within the Department of Music. A veteran music educator of forty years, she previously taught instrumental music in the public schools of Mississippi. Now in her thirty-third year at Mississippi State, Ms. Lance has guided the band program through the completion of a multimillion-dollar rehearsal facility and construction of a new synthetic turf practice field. Under her leadership, the band program has seen the expansion of the band staff and a student enrollment that now includes five concert bands, jazz band, two basketball pep bands, and a marching band with an enrollment of more than 400 students.

As a conductor, she has led the Wind Ensemble in performances for international concert audiences, including a 2008 tour of the British Isles; a 2011 tour in Austria and Germany; an Italian tour in 2014 which included a performance at the International Music Meeting in Padova, Italy; and a 2019 tour of Austria and the Czech Republic. The Wind Ensemble is preparing for a performance tour of Spain in May of 2025. Ms. Lance maintains an active schedule as a clinician and adjudicator for both concert and marching band events throughout the country. Additionally, she is a frequent contributor to the Teaching Music Through Performance in Band series. In 2011, she received the "State Pride" award from the College of Education for excellence in teaching, research, and service and the Edythe M. McArthur Outstanding Woman Band Director Award for the state of Mississippi. She was named

Outstanding Bandmaster for Mississippi in 2015 and in 2024, and in 2017 was named Outstanding Contributor to Bands in Mississippi by the Delta Chapter of Phi Beta Mu. She was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association in 2018.

Ms. Lance has served as the state chair for the College Band Directors National Association and the National Band Association. Additionally, she has served as a member of the Athletic Band Committee for the College Band Directors National Association. She is Past President of the International Bandmasters Fraternity Phi Beta Mu and was recently elected as Vice President of the National Band Association. Additional professional memberships include the Mississippi Bandmasters Association, Kappa Kappa Psi, Sigma Alpha Iota, and the National Association for Music Education.
