Our guided tour provides a perspective of the mission to bring law and justice to the area from the home of the chief prosecutor of the famous court of Judge Isaac C. Parker." This historic Victorian home will be our host for a traditional "low tea" (pastry and tea) after our tour. The cost of the tour and tea is \$10 per person. You will need to pre-register for this event so the caterers know how many to prepare for.

After BDK pics, wonderful concerts by the Arkansas Instruments and of course the ABA Banquet and door prizes, the evening will conclude with the big band sounds of the Jubilation Jazz Band as they present an authentic 1940s radio show for us. It should be a LOT of fun!
