He was Head Director at HL Bourgeois High School before moving to Texas. In Texas, he taught at La Porte High School for 14 years and Katy High School for 18 years. Ensembles he directed were the marching band, symphonic band, cadet band, full orchestra and jazz project. He recently retired and works part time at a middle school and does clinics, master classes, and private lessons throughout the Houston area. Mr. Fremin resides in Katy, Texas where he lives with his wife and youngest daughter.

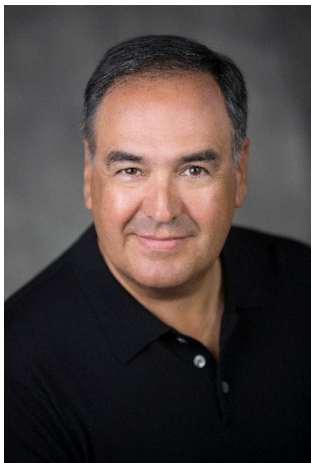
Stan Schoonover

Stan Schoonover has been Music Director of the Fairfax Wind Symphony since its' founding in 1999. His thirty-two-year career in public school education included Bangor [PA], Mt. Vernon, West Springfield, and Robinson high schools [VA], and eleven years as Music Supervisor for the Fairfax County [VA] Public Schools. Ensembles under his direction have appeared three times at the Mid-West Clinic, the National Concert Band Festival, the Mid-East Clinic, Carnegie Hall, The National Music Clinic, The Kennedy Center, Soldiers and Sailors Hall, the GMU Center of the Arts, the Forbes Center, and at fifteen VMEA In-Service Conferences. For more than twenty years, his bands received championship honors and superior ratings in more than 10 states and Canada. The John Philip Sousa Foundation awarded the Sudler Silver Scroll to the Fairfax Wind Symphony in December of 2019. Mr. Schoonover has been an Adjunct Instructor at James Madison University, a member of the MFA Educational Team, and the Midwest Clinic Advisory Committee.



Mr. Schoonover received degrees from Gettysburg College and West Chester University. He is an active Past-President of the Virginia Band and Orchestras Directors Association [VBODA], and an elected member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association. He was named to the 2018 VBODA Hall of Fame, the 2017 Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame, received the 2012 VBODA Phillip J. Fuller Award, and the 2006 VMEA Outstanding Administrator Award. In October of 2004, Mr. Schoonover was inducted into the East Stroudsburg (PA) Music Hall of Fame. Marquis Who's Who presented him with the 2017 Albert Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award.

Kerry Taylor



Kerry Taylor concluded a distinguished 35-year tenure as Director of Bands at Westlake High School and Fine Arts Director for Eanes ISD, capping a remarkable 42-year career in Texas public education. A proud alumnus of the University of Texas at Austin, he earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees in music.

Under his guidance, the Westlake Band became one of the state's most decorated programs, earning 34 straight UIL Sweepstakes Awards and achieving national and international recognition. The Westlake Wind Ensemble appeared three times at the Midwest Clinic, four times at Carnegie Hall, and performed for both the American Bandmasters Association and WASBE. The program received the prestigious *Sudler Flag of Honor* in 1999 and the *Sudler Shield* in 2011. The Chaparral Marching Band represented the community in the Tournament of Roses Parade in 2003, 2017, and 2024. Additional honors include being named a Phi Beta Mu "Program of Distinction" in 2017 and the Texas Bandmasters Association "Program of Distinction" in 2023.

Mr. Taylor continues to contribute to the profession as a sought-after clinician and adjudicator. A Past President of both the American Bandmasters Association and the Texas Music Educators Association, he has been recognized with the UIL Sponsor of Excellence Award, the Sousa Foundation's Legion of Honor, and the Texas Bandmasters Association Meritorious Achievement Award. He has also received the NBA Presidential Medal of Distinction and was recently inducted into the Phi Beta Mu Texas Bandmaster Hall of Fame.

Zachary J. Harris



Zachary J. Harris has taught instrumental music for 38 years in schools in Mississippi. He is currently part-time music instructor at William Carey University, where he teaches music education courses and supervises instrumental student interns. Prior to his retirement, Mr. Harris was Director of Bands for the Gulfport School District, where he oversaw all instrumental wind programs for the district. He conducted the Symphonic Band, taught music for the marching band, and served as Department Chairperson.

Mr. Harris, a native of Jackson, Mississippi, received his Bachelor of Music Education from Mississippi Valley State University and his Master of Music Education from the University of Mississippi. He is a member of Mississippi Bandmasters Association Inc., where he was past president, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi Music Fraternity, Omega Psi Phi International Fraternity Incorporated, National Federation High School Music Association, and Phi Beta Mu where he served on the Executive Board. Mr. Harris has served on regional and state level music committees in Mississippi. He was the Southeastern Representative for the National Federation of

State High School Association's Music Committee from 1997-2001. Mr. Harris has been guest clinician throughout the southeastern states. He presently serves on Music for All's Education Team as a guest clinician.

Mr. Harris' bands have received superior ratings consistently through the years in marching, sight-reading, and concert. In December 2018, Zachary J. Harris was inducted in the Phi Beta Mu's Delta Chapter of Mississippi's Hall of Fame and in 2021 was inducted into the Magnolia Band Directors Association Hall of Fame. On January 27, 2024 Mr. Harris was inducted into the Gulf Coast Band Directors Association Hall of Fame. Zachary is married to Sheila, and they have two beautiful daughters Brianna and Zacharia.

Glenn Lambert

Glenn Lambert is the Executive Secretary for UIL Region 24 Music, where he facilitates all UIL music contests for Frisco, Little Elm, McKinney, and Prosper school districts. His responsibilities were administering K-12 Band, Choir, Orchestra, Theatre, Dance, Art, and Elementary Music for 19 campuses in the school district.

His responsibilities included the co-direction of the marching band, concert bands, and jazz band. Prior to his tenure in Wylie, Mr. Lambert held band director positions in the Plano, Garland, and Arlington School Districts.

She graduated from the University of Houston with a bachelor's degree in music education, and a master's degree in instrumental conducting from Sam Houston State University.

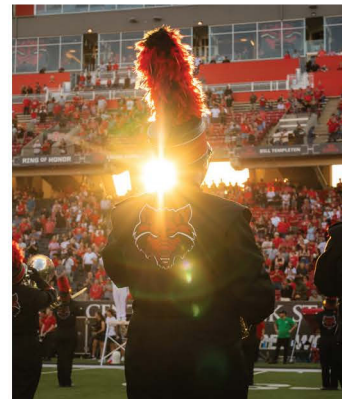
Mrs. Royall's middle school performing ensembles earned consistent sweepstakes and outstanding in class awards. In 1990, the Bammel Middle School Symphonic Band was named the Texas Music Educators Association Class CC State Honor Band and performed at the state convention in San Antonio in 1991. The band was a top three finalist in the Class CCC State Honor Band competition in 1996 and 1998.

The College Park High School Band consistently earned superior ratings at Texas UIL marching, concert, and sightreading contests every year of its existence, also receiving outstanding in class awards at marching and concert festivals. In 2010, the College Park Wind Ensemble was a state finalist in the TMEA Class 5A honor band competition. They were also named 2010, 2012, and 2014 winners of the Mark of Excellence National Wind Band Honors. In 2016, the marching band competed in the UIL state marching contest, finishing in the top 20.

Mrs. Royall has presented clinics in several states, including Texas (TMEA and TBA), Arkansas, Louisiana, Indiana, Illinois, Utah, Georgia, North and South Carolina, and the Midwest Clinic. She also conducted three ensembles at the Midwest Clinic. Mrs. Royall served a seven-year term on the executive board for the Texas Bandmasters Association and served as the first female president in 1999. Mrs. Royall is a member of ABA, TMEA, TBA, TMAA, WBDI, and Phi Beta Mu. In 1999, she received the University of Houston, Moore's School of Music, Distinguished Alumnus Award. In 2009, she received the TBA Meritorious Achievement Award, and in 2023, was inducted into the Phi Beta Mu Texas Bandmasters Hall of Fame and the American Bandmasters Association. Presently, she is serving Texas band directors as a consultant/clinician and mentoring student teachers as a field supervisor for Sam Houston State University. She has also performed on flute in the Spring ISD Alumni Band and The Woodlands Concert Band.
