# 2013 Arkansas All-State Clinicians

## JEFFREY GROGAN – CHAMBER ORCHESTRA

Applauded for performances “high in energy, with close attention to ebb and flow,” American conductor **Jeffrey Grogan** is hailed as a musical leader who “knows what kind of sound he wants from an orchestra,” “rich and vibrant.” His humanistic leadership style, coupled with a strong command of skills as a musical communicator, has earned him an impressive reputation with audiences and music programs throughout the country. Known for “shrewd programming, skillful rehearsing, and an energized performance,” Grogan was recently chosen to participate in the prestigious Bruno Walter National Conductor Preview sponsored by the League of American Orchestras.

Grogan is in his seventh season as the Education and Community Engagement Conductor for the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, where he leads the NJSO in a variety of concerts each season. He has also recently conducted performances with the Little Orchestra Society of New York, Adelphi Chamber Orchestra and the New York Concerti Sinfonietta where the reviewer stated, “Maestro Grogan was an ideal partner. Under his direction, orchestra and soloist rose to a glorious culmination in the last movement, glowing with passionate fervor evocative of Scriabin’s orchestral masterwork, “Poem of Ecstasy.” The performance was deservedly greeted by cheers from the capacity audience.”

Grogan considers his work with young musicians one of the cornerstones of his career. He serves as conductor and Artistic Director of the Greater Newark Youth Orchestras, the InterSchool Orchestras of New York and the New Jersey Youth Symphony. Just this past season, his youth orchestras have performed to capacity crowds at both Carnegie Hall and the Musikverein in Vienna. He has recently appeared as a guest conductor at the University of Georgia, Indiana University, the Manhattan School of Music, and the Mannes School of Music Pre-College Division.

Grogan was previously on faculty at the University of Michigan, Ithaca College and Baylor University. He taught public school in the Desoto (Texas) Independent School District. Grogan is a graduate of Stephen F. Austin State University and the University of Michigan.



## CHRISTIAN CARICHNER – SECOND JAZZ BAND



**Christian Carichner**, originally from New York, graduated Magna Cum Laude from Ithaca College in 2005 with a degree in music education and performance. After graduating from Ithaca, Christian moved to Arizona to begin work on a Master of Music degree in tuba performance with Professor Sam Pilafian at Arizona State University, and graduated in 2007. Currently, Christian is the Visiting Assistant Professor of Tuba at The University of Central Arkansas. At UCA he instructs the tuba studio, assists with the UCA Marching Band, directs the tuba-euphonium ensemble, and teaches low brass methods. During the summer months, Christian is the Brass Caption Head with The Academy Drum and Bugle Corps (2006 Division II World Champions) and was formerly on the brass staff with Phantom Regiment (2006 Division I Second Place).

Christian is a highly sought-after clinician because of his intimate knowledge of The Breathing Gym, a pedagogy developed by his primary teachers, Sam Pilafian and Patrick Sheridan. Christian has presented clinics on breathing and various other topics at Estrella Mountain Community College, Paradise Valley Community College, the East Valley Youth Symphony, and public schools in Las Vegas, Tucson, Austin, and Ithaca.

In addition to his teaching, Christian also has an active international performing career. He is Principal Tubist with the Conway Symphony and the faculty brass quintet at UCA, Pinnacle Brass. Recent solo performances include the Conway Symphony Orchestra, UCA Wind Ensemble, North High School Band in Arizona, Horseheads High School Wind Ensemble in New York, a performance at the Southwest Regional Tuba-Euphonium Conference, the Little Rock Wind Symphony, and the International Tuba Euphonium Conference. Christian has also performed with the Arizona Musicfest Orchestra, the Tampa Tradewinds, the Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes, Pinnacle Brass, Rhythm and Brass, Proteus 7, Salt River Brass, and has performed with the national tour of the hit Broadway musical *Chicago*.

## PETER BARENBRIDGE – FIRST JAZZ BAND

**Pete BarenBregge** performs on alto, tenor, soprano and baritone saxophone, flute, piccolo, alto flute, clarinet and bass clarinet. With a B.S. degree in Music Education from West Chester University, Pete taught instrumental music in the Wilmington area. Moving on, Pete won an audition and enlisted in the US Air Force to perform with the premier jazz group, the Airmen of Note, based in Washington, D.C. He was a featured soloist with the band and was appointed musical director and NCOIC (Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge) and soon promoted to the rank of Chief Master Sergeant. He has been a featured soloist on over 19 Airmen of Note albums and the producer of seven of the group's stellar recordings during his highly successful military career.

As a professional musician, he has traveled extensively through 49 states, and 26 countries. He has performed for kings, queens, presidents and millions of people worldwide. He has performed and conducted in some of the finest concert halls such as Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center, the Meyerhoff, the Myerson Theater in Dallas, San Francisco's Davis Hall and numerous world-class opera halls in Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Panama, Uruguay, jazz clubs throughout the D.C. region and the prestigious Montreux Jazz Festival.

Pete has done extensive recording for radio, television, and record singles. He has collaborated with top names including Patti LaBelle, Randy Brecker, Bob Berg, Mary Chapin Carpenter, Stevie Wonder, Mel Torme, Diana Ross, Henry Mancini, Joe Williams, Dizzy Gillespie, Tony Bennett, Sammy Davis Jr., Frank Sinatra, and many, many others. Pete has recorded on over 31 albums. Currently he is the instrumental jazz editor for Alfred Music Publishing Co. and is responsible for the publication of thousands of jazz print products. Pete was elected to two terms as a member of the NARAS board of governors, and is a voting member of the Grammys. He is the musical director of the Columbia Jazz Band, Columbia, Maryland. He is a busy freelance professional musician in the Washington/Baltimore area.

Pete leads his own jazz group and is a Summit Records recording artist. With co-leader Frank Russo, they have recorded three CDs, PF Flyer, Point of Grace, and A Thousand Eyes. The CDs received critical acclaim in DownBeat and Jazz Times magazines.

Prior to his appointment at IUP, Dr. Beeken taught at Michigan State University where he conducted the Women's Glee Club and while residing in Des Moines, Iowa, directed the Drake Chorale at Drake University. He also taught elementary, middle school, and high school music for sixteen years. While serving as Director of Vocal Music for Waukee Schools in suburban Des Moines he led a program of over 300 students and twelve ensembles to national distinction.

## DR. KRISTINA CASWELL-MACMULLEN – FEMALE CHORUS

**Kristina Caswell MacMullen** serves as a Visiting Assistant Professor of Choral Studies at The Ohio State University, where she conducts the Symphonic Choir and instructs both undergraduate and graduate students in the areas of conducting and choral pedagogy. Dr. Caswell-MacMullen is developing a national reputation as an emerging conductor and scholar. Guest conducting appearances during the 2012-13 season involve students in Arkansas, Kansas, Michigan, Missouri, North Carolina, and Texas. In 2011, she was runner-up in the National American Choral Director's Association graduate level conducting competition. She was also named an alternate for the prestigious Fulbright Fellowship to Slovenia, where her research interests involve the innovations of conductor Karmina Šilec. She was the winner of the Don and Kay Cash Fellowship, and most recently, she was named a graduate student of distinction for Texas Tech University. Her teaching and conducting is featured on the DVD "Conducting-Teaching: Real World Strategies for Success" published by GIA (2009).

From 2001-2009, Caswell-MacMullen enjoyed a diverse career as a public school teacher in both Michigan and Tennessee. Throughout these eight years of teaching, she interacted with students in rural, suburban, and urban settings, elementary through high school. While teaching in the public schools, her ensembles were invited to perform at both the Michigan Music Conference and the Michigan Youth Arts Festival. In addition to public school teaching, Caswell-MacMullen has enjoyed conducting community choral ensembles. She has presented and co-presented interest sessions at the College Music Society's International Conference, the Music Educator's National Conference, the Michigan Music Conference, and the Michigan School's Vocal Music Association Summer Workshop. Caswell-MacMullen earned both the Bachelor of Music Education and the Master of Music degrees from Michigan State University. She completed the Doctorate of Musical Arts at Texas Tech University.



## DR. SANDRA SNOW – MIXED CHOIR



As conductor, teacher, and scholar, **Sandra Snow's** work spans a wide variety of ages, abilities, and musics. She holds appointments in conducting and music education at the Michigan State University College of Music, where she interacts with undergraduate and graduate students in the areas of conducting, choral pedagogy, and choral singing. She is a recipient of the MSU Teacher-Scholar Award. Snow conducts the Michigan State University Women's Chamber Ensemble, a group that has appeared at consecutive conferences of the American Choral Directors Association (National Conference 2009; Central Division 2008; MI-ACDA 2007).

Upcoming conducting engagements include conducting master-classes for the 2013 Festival 500 Choral Festival in Newfoundland, Canada, the Iowa All-State Mixed Choir, the Oklahoma All-State Women's Choir, and the Tucson Women's Choir Festival. Dr. Snow is author of *Conducting-Teaching: Real World Strategies for Success* (2009 GIA). Recent publications include *Dreaming, Musing, Imagining: Preparation for Engaged Learning in the High School Choral Classroom* (Choral Journal, Feb. 2011) and *We Sing Ourselves: An Essay About Teaching and Learning With Women in Conducting Women's Choirs: Strategies for Success* (edited chapter, 2013 GIA).

## DR. MARK LAYCOCK – ORCHESTRA

**Dr. Mark Laycock** is an Associate Professor of Music at Wichita State University, where he holds the Ann Walenta Faculty of Distinction Endowed Professorship. He has been recognized with the WSU Excellence in Creative Activity Award (2012) and the College of Fine Arts Excellence in Teaching Award (2007). At WSU, Dr. Laycock serves as Director of Orchestras and Coordinator of Strings. WSU Symphony Orchestra appearances under his direction include the 2008 International Festival of Youth Orchestras in Zaragoza, Spain, a May 2011 concert at Carnegie Hall, and multiple invited performances at Kansas Music Educators Association In-Service Workshops. Dr. Laycock is a member of the Board of Directors of the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic; he was recently appointed Chair of Orchestra Activities. His work as guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator spans 22 states, including the leadership of all-state orchestras in Alabama, Arizona, Iowa, Maryland, Nebraska, and Washington. Upcoming engagements include the Wichita Symphony Orchestra and district and regional ensembles in Kansas, Missouri, Wisconsin, and Nevada, as well as the Arkansas All-State Orchestra. He was an adjudicator for the 2011 National Orchestra Festival and a clinician for the event in 2012. His appearances with professional ensembles include the Wichita Symphony Orchestra, Wichita Grand Opera, and Opera Kansas, as well as orchestras in Slovakia and Canada. Dr. Laycock has presented clinic sessions for state education conferences in Arizona, Florida, Kansas, Minnesota, and Oklahoma, as well as the American String Teachers Association National Conference, the Northwest Division Convention of the Music Educators National Conference, and the Midwest Clinic. He served as Director of Orchestras and Instrumental Music at Chapman University in Orange, California, where he led invited performances for the California Music Educators Association and at Disneyland. He was also Principal Conductor of the Irvine (CA) Classical Players, leading the youth orchestra on concert tours to France in 2008 and Italy in 2006. From 1998-2003, Dr. Laycock served as Director of Orchestral Activities at Iowa State University and was Music Director of the Central Iowa Symphony. Under his leadership, the ISU Symphony Orchestra performed at the North Central Division Convention of the Music Educators National Association and collaborated with such artists as bass-baritone Simon Estes and pianist-composer Marvin Hamlisch. He earned a Doctor of Arts degree in orchestral conducting from the University of Northern Colorado. Dr. Laycock holds a Master of Music degree in instrumental conducting from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and a Bachelor of Arts degree in music history and literature from the University of Southern California. An experienced educator, he was an instructor of strings and orchestra at the middle and high school levels in the Clark County School District in Las Vegas, Nevada.



## DAVID STARNES – CONCERT BAND

**David Starnes** joined the School of Music at Western Carolina University in the summer of 2011 as Assistant Professor/Director of Athletic Bands. He directs the Pride of the Mountains Marching Band and the Symphonic Band. A native of Chattanooga, Tennessee, Mr. Starnes graduated magna cum laude from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville in 1988, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education. Prior to coming to Western Carolina, Mr. Starnes was the founding Director of Bands at Kennesaw Mountain High School in Kennesaw, Georgia, where he served for eleven years.

Mr. Starnes is sought out nationally and internationally as an adjudicator, clinician, guest conductor and creative designer. He serves as an adjudicator for several state, national, and international organizations including Bands of America (where he is a member of the Advisory Board), Winter Guard International, and Drum Corps International, where he served as an adjudicator and Percussion Caption Head from 1998-2002. He was the Program Coordinator for Spirit Drum and Bugle Corps from 2003-2007 during which time they were four-time world-class finalists. Mr. Starnes is a member of the Yamaha Educational Artist program and an educational artist for Innovative Percussion and Evans Drumheads. He also serves as an Education Consultant at Music For All in Indianapolis, Indiana, and was appointed program director for the Honor Band of America, which appeared in the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California in 2005 and 2009.

Under Mr. Starnes's leadership, the Kennesaw Mountain High School band program grew from 85 students to over 250 members. Kennesaw Mountain bands have been recognized at local, state, and national levels for their achievements in all areas of performance including concert band, jazz band, marching band, winter guard, and winter percussion. They are four-time Regional Champions in Bands of America events, a six-time national finalist at the Grand National Championships, and were named the 2004 Bands of America AAA National Champions. In December of 2003, the John Philip Sousa Foundation presented the Kennesaw Mountain High School Band the prestigious Sudler Shield of Excellence for outstanding achievement in marching band. In 2005, the band appeared in the 79th Annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City. The Kennesaw Mountain High School Wind Symphony performed at the 60th Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic held in Chicago, Illinois in December of 2006.

Mr. Starnes is married to Rhea Jeanne Starnes, an architect, and they have a teenage daughter, Hannah. In his spare time, Mr. Starnes enjoys Indianapolis Colts football and playing with his two dogs, Oliver and Peyton.



## ROBERT JORGENSEN – SYMPHONIC BAND



**Robert D. Jorgensen** is Director of Bands and Professor of Music at The University of Akron. He also serves as Assistant Director of the School of Music. Under his direction, The University of Akron Symphonic Band has been invited to perform at eleven conferences of the Ohio Music Education Association, the 1992 conference of the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA) in East Lansing, Michigan, the 1998 CBDNA conference in Kansas City, Missouri, the 2003 American Bandmasters Association Convention at the University of Maryland in College Park, Maryland, and the 2004 CBDNA conference at the Cincinnati Conservatory/College of Music. The Symphonic Band also performed at Severance Hall in Cleveland in April 2003.

Professor Jorgensen has been widely honored as a music educator and conductor. He received the Outstanding Bandmasters Award from the International Assembly of Phi Beta Mu, International Bandmasters Fraternity, at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago, Illinois, in 1999. He received the Citation of Excellence Award from the National Band Association in 1981 and the A. Frank Martin Award from Kappa Kappa Psi in 1992. In 1991, Mr. Jorgensen was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association and is a Past-President of this organization, having been elected to this office at the 74th annual convention in Miami, Florida in March 2008. He is also Past President of the Mid-American Conference Band Directors Association.

Mr. Jorgensen earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Illinois, where he was a student of Mark H. Hindsley and a master's degree from Michigan State University, where he was a student of Leonard Falcone and Kenneth Bloomquist. From 1969-1972, he was euphonium soloist with the United States Army Field Band in Washington, D.C., Hal Gibson and Samuel Fricano, conductors. Prior to joining the faculty at The University of Akron in 1987, Professor Jorgensen was on the faculty at Morehead State University, Kentucky, and was Director of Bands at Midwestern State University, Texas. His concert band in Texas performed for the Texas Music Educators Association convention and the Texas Bandmasters Association convention.

## ANTHONY MAIELLO – WIND SYMPHONY

**Anthony J. Maiello** received both his bachelor's and master's degrees in music from Ithaca College in 1965 and 1967, respectively. He also studied at the National Conducting Institute in Washington, D.C., under the direction of Mr. Leonard Slatkin, former Musical Director of the National Symphony Orchestra. He has served as a Cover Conductor for the National Symphony Orchestra at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Washington, D.C.

Mr. Maiello's many professional credits include clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor of All-State, All-State Sectional, Regional, District, All-County and All-City ensembles, with appearances throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, England, Europe, The Netherlands and The Bahamas. He conducted musical activities for the Gold Medal Ceremonies at the 1980 Olympics in Lake Placid, New York, the New York State Music Camp & Institute; has served as New York State Music Association adjudicator; clinician with Yamaha, and clinician for Warner Bros. Publications, President of the International Association of Jazz Educators - New York State Chapter and as Musical Director for Music Festivals International. He is an elected member of The American Bandmasters Association and ASCAP, and holds membership in the National Band Association, College Band Directors National Association, New York State School Music Association, Virginia Music Educators Association, Virginia Jazz Service Organization, The College Music Society and The American Symphony Orchestra League. Mr. Maiello's academic experience includes extensive teaching in the public schools. He served as Professor of Music and Chairman of Performance at the Crane School of Music, Potsdam College of SUNY, Potsdam, New York, where his duties included advanced instrumental conducting, applied clarinet, woodwind and percussion techniques, and conductor of the Crane Wind Ensemble. Under his direction, the ensembles at Crane and George Mason University have commissioned many new works, made numerous recordings and appearances statewide and at regional and national conferences in the United States and Canada. He is the author of CONDUCTING: A HANDS-ON-APPROACH, CONDUCTING NUANCES: LITTLE THINGS MEAN A LOT, and co-author of the 21st CENTURY BAND METHOD.



Anthony Maiello travels widely presenting clinics, lectures and workshops, and guest conducting and adjudicating numerous music festivals. He is presently an Associate Director of the School of Music and Professor of Music at George Mason University, Fairfax, Virginia. Mr. Maiello has also served as Associate Conductor of The McLean Orchestra, McLean, Virginia, has been appointed an Honorary Conductor of The United States Navy Band, Washington, D.C. and is presently the conductor of the American Symphonic Winds and American Festival Philharmonic Orchestra, Washington, D.C. Professor Maiello is the founder and Conductor/Artistic Director of the American Festival Pops Orchestra, a professional ensemble in the greater Washington, D.C. metropolitan area dedicated to promoting popular American Music.
