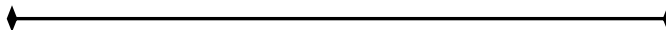

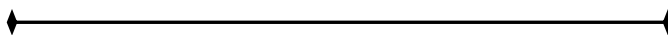

2010 Arkansas All-State Clinicians

JAMES GREESON – SECOND JAZZ BAND



Dr. James Greeson is a Professor of Music Composition, and director of Jazz Studies at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville. In 2009 he was awarded an Emmy for his original soundtrack for the documentary "The Buffalo Flows" which was broadcast nationally on PBS stations. His compositions are published by the Oriana Press in Cardiff, Wales; the University of Northern Colorado Jazz Press, and Subito Music and have been performed in Carnegie Hall and in concert halls across the U.S. Also active as a guitarist Dr. Greeson is the guitar consultant for Kendor Jazz publications in New York. He has performed on guitar and bass with a number of jazz luminaries, including Randy Brecker, Mose Allison, Mulgrew Miller, Bruce Barth, Roseanna Vitro, Nneena Freelon. At the University of Arkansas he teaches composition, music theory, directs the UA Jazz Ensemble, and teaches guitar and bass. In 2008 he was named as a Fulbright College Master Teacher.

MIKE VAX – FIRST JAZZ BAND

Mike Vax is an International Artist for the Getzen Musical Instrument Company. He is also a Summit Records recording artist. Mr. Vax performs exclusively on Getzen trumpets, cornets and flugelhorns. He has played lead and solo trumpet with the Stan Kenton Orchestra, the Clark Terry Big Bad Band, and the U.S. Navy Show Band. Mike has also performed and/or recorded with such greats as Art Pepper, Gene Krupa, Al Grey, Freddy Hubbard, John Handy, Don Ellis, Don Jacoby, Louie Bellson, Joe Williams, Anita O'Day, June Christy, Barbara McNair, the Four Freshmen, The Glenn Miller and Jimmy Dorsey Orchestras, the Beverly Hills Unlisted Jazz Band, and the Dukes of Dixieland in New Orleans.



He has appeared as guest lead trumpet and soloist with symphony pops orchestras around the United States, and in Europe, as well as the All-American Collegiate Orchestra at Disneyworld. As a recording musician, he has performed on more than 75 albums, including 20 under his own name. He is the founder and Chairman of the Board of Friends of Big Band Jazz, a 501c3 nonprofit corporation that has given over \$40,000 in scholarships to jazz camps, funds to jazz programs in schools, and recently made a donation to Habitat for Humanity for the Musicians Village in New Orleans. Currently he is leading his own groups: The Mike Vax Jazz Orchestra, The Mike Vax Big Band (featuring alumni of the Stan Kenton Orchestra), TRPTS (Trumpets), The Great American Jazz Band and the Mike Vax Quintet and Sextet. Mike has done workshops and concerts in over 2000 high schools, colleges and universities all around the world, over the past 39 years. He is very active as a clinician and soloist in both the classical and jazz idioms.

DR. PAUL TUCKER – MALE CHORUS



Dr. Tucker is the Director of Choral Activities at The University of Kansas in Lawrence, Kansas, where he teaches Graduate Choral Conducting, Orchestral Bowing for Conductors, directs two of KU's ten choral ensembles, and oversees all aspects of the choral program. Born in Kingston, Jamaica, Dr. Tucker studied conducting and piano at the Jamaica School of Music with Dr. Kaestner Robertson. His musical experience includes owning and operating Sabre Sound Studio in Riverside, California, where he produced and performed on albums for various recording artists. He earned a Bachelor's of Music degree from the University of Texas at Arlington, a Masters of Music, and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of North Texas.

He has taught choral music at the Junior High, High School, and Collegiate levels, and has also served as the Director of Bands at the Junior High and High School levels. As a choral clinician, conductor, and adjudicator, Dr. Tucker has traveled across the United States, the Caribbean, Hawaii, and Europe. Well-known for his unique approach to the tuning of choral ensembles, Dr. Tucker's special interest in this particular area of music research has led him to develop a methodical approach to tuning. In addition to teaching his method in choral clinics, he has outlined these steps in a paper entitled *Choral Intonation: A Proactive Approach*.

Prior to joining the faculty at KU, Dr. Tucker served as the Director of Choral Activities at Richland College in Dallas, Texas. He is the Founder, Artistic Director, and Conductor of Paradigm Vocal Ensemble, a semi-professional choral ensemble based in Arlington, Texas. With this ensemble, he has recorded five compact discs, *The Best of Paradigm*, *What Sweeter Music*, *Christmas Through the Ages*, *Paradigm Vocal Ensemble 10 Year Reunion*, and *Sing 'til the Spirit Moves*. Dr. Tucker pursues a varied music career as a conductor, pianist, composer/arranger, and record producer. Alliance Music Publishing and Neumark Music Publishing distribute his compositions. Dr. Tucker is also a licensed pilot who holds an Airline Transport Rating and has worked as a professional pilot. His identical twin, Stephen, is the Director of Orchestral Studies at The University of California, Irvine. Dr. Tucker resides in Lawrence, Kansas, with his wife Vicki and their two children Carly and Jordan.

JO SCURLOCK-DILLARD – FEMALE CHORUS

Jo Scurlock-Dillard has taught secondary Choral Music and Theatre Arts for the past 33 years in both Texas and California. A native of Texas, Jo attended Stephen F. Austin State University, where she earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Vocal Performance and Acting and a Master of Arts in Theatre. In 1999, Jo was named as the Outstanding Music Alumna at S.F.A.S.U.

Mrs. Scurlock-Dillard has been teaching San Antonio's North East Independent School District for the past seventeen years. Currently, she teaches Choral Music at Ronald Reagan High School, where she also serves as the Fine Arts Chairperson. Previously, she taught choral music at NEISD's MacArthur High School, South Houston High School, Aldine High School and Eisenhower High School. On three different occasions, Jo has served as an All State section leader. Choirs under her direction have served as demonstration choirs for Janet Galvan and the late B. R. Henson at TMEA conventions. In 1997, while teaching at MacArthur High School, her Women's Chamber Choir was invited to perform for the TMEA Convention and in 1998, the same choir performed for the SWACDA Convention in Corpus Christi. In 1999, the MacArthur Women's Choir performed for the National ACDA Convention in Chicago and the MacArthur Concert Chorale, a mixed choir, performed for the TMEA Convention. This choir also served as a demonstration choir in a session conducted by Dr. Barbara Baker for the National ACDA Convention. Jo is very active as a guest clinician and conductor. In 2000, she was the conductor of the Arkansas All State Choir. In 2000, her mixed choir from Reagan HS was a demonstration choir at the TMEA Convention. She was one of the recipients for the Southwestern Bell UIL Sponsor of the Year Awards in 2001. Last year, her Reagan High School Women's Chorus sang at the annual Texas Music Educators Association's Convention.



Scurlock-Dillard served on the Texas Music Educators Association Executive Board from 2003-2008. She also served as Region 12's Vocal Chair for five years and TMEA Area D's chair for two years. Jo has served on the UIL Sight-reading Committee, Prescribed Music List Committee and numerous Advisory committees. She has also chaired the TCDA Ways and Means Committee. From 2001-2005, she chaired SWACDA's Repertoire and Standards for Women's Choirs Committee. Choirs under her direction are consistent Sweepstakes Award Recipients at UIL Contests that have been named "Best In Class" at Choral Festivals in Los Angeles, Houston, Nashville, Breckenridge, and Dallas. The Reagan Choirs under her direction have sung at the Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, St. Stephen's Basilica in Rome, The San Marco Basilica in Venice, the Salzburg Cathedral and St. Stephen's Basilica in Budapest. She is a member of TMEA, TMAA, ACDA, and TCDA.

DR. BETSY COOK WEBER – MIXED CHORUS



Betsy Cook Weber is an Associate Professor of Music and Director of Choral Studies at the University of Houston's Moores School of Music. She teaches a full load of coursework, oversees the large and varied activities of the choral area at the Moores School, and is also highly active as a clinician, adjudicator, lecturer, and conductor.

Under direction, the Moores School Concert Chorale has received national and international acclaim. Most recently, *Concert Chorale* performed and competed in the 47th *Eisteddfod* in Llangollen, Wales, UK, one of the world's most prestigious choral competitions. Under Dr. Weber's direction, *Chorale* was selected to represent the United States in the *Eisteddfod's* opening concert; they were also accepted into four competitive categories. Concert Chorale won or placed in every category in which they were entered, receiving two third places (Youth Chorus and Folk Song), one second place (Mixed Chorus), and a first prize in the coveted Chamber Choir category. Judges comments included "de luxe singing, eliciting admiration and gratitude," "wonderfully elegant and humorous," "sophisticated choir --- expertly prepared and with a finely-tuned corporate ear."

In 2008, *Chorale* received a standing ovation as one of the featured choirs of the 2008 Texas Music Educators Convention in San Antonio TMEA convention. The year before, *Chorale* sang at the national convention of the American Choral Directors Association in Miami, March 2007, again receiving standing ovations. ACDA performances were described in *ChoralNet* as "simply outstanding."

Equally important is Dr. Weber's work training young choral conductors. In March 2009, student Gregory McDaniel won first place in the ACDA National Conducting Competition (undergraduates) in Oklahoma City. Two former students will present their choirs to the membership of the Texas Music Educators Association convention in February 2010. Before coming to the University of Houston, Dr. Weber was a successful music teacher in the public schools at the elementary, middle school, and high school levels, during which time choirs under her direction won numerous competitions and awards.

She also served seven years as Assistant and, later, Associate Director of the Houston Symphony Chorus, helping prepare major works for renowned conductors including Robert Shaw, Christoph Eschenbach, Roger Wagner, Nicholas McKegan, and Christopher Seaman. Dr. Weber holds degrees from the University of North Texas, Westminster Choir College (Princeton, NJ), and the University of Houston.

2010 Arkansas All-State Clinicians

DAVID ITKIN – ORCHESTRA

The 2009-2010 season marks **Maestro David Itkin's** 3rd season as Conductor of the Las Vegas Philharmonic, his 5th season as Conductor of the Abilene Philharmonic, and his 17th and final year as Music Director and Conductor of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra. In addition, Maestro Itkin is currently serving in his 2nd year as Director of Orchestral Studies at the University of North Texas College of Music. In May 2009 Maestro Itkin was awarded both an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters by Lyon College and the *Above the Barre* award by Ballet Arkansas.

During past seasons Maestro Itkin's career has taken him to 44 U.S. states and 15 countries in Europe, the Middle East, and Asia, including concerts and recordings with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, the Slovenska Filhamonija, the San Diego Symphony, and the Seoul Philharmonic. Mr. Itkin's first film score ("Sugar Creek") was recorded in 2006 by the Arkansas Symphony for the film's 2007 release. His most recent major work, "Exodus", an oratorio, was premiered in April 2005 in Little Rock, with William Shatner narrating. "Exodus" was released world-wide on CD in 2007.

Maestro Itkin's previous positions include serving as Music Director and Principal Conductor of the Lake Forest Symphony Orchestra in Chicago (1997-2000), Music Director/Conductor of the Kingsport Symphony (Tenn.) (1992-1995), Music Director of the Birmingham Opera Theatre (1992-1995), and Music Director for the Lucius Woods Festival Concerts in Solon Springs, Wisconsin (1993-2000). From 1988 to 1993 he served as Associate Conductor of the Alabama Symphony Orchestra, during which time he was made Honorary Lt. Governor of the State of Alabama for outstanding service to the Arts.



DR. RYAN NELSON – CONCERT BAND



Ryan T. Nelson is an Assistant Professor of Music at Northwestern University, where he conducts the Contemporary Music Ensemble, is co-director of New Music Northwestern, and conducts the Symphonic Band. Ryan works very closely with Northwestern's Music Theatre program, music directing and supervising several productions each year, including the famed Waa-Mu Show. He also served on the American Music Theatre Project executive committee, music directing and supervising the premieres of "Was," "The Boys Are Coming Home," "Asphalt Beach," "Boy in the Bubble," and "Dangerous Beauty." At the Marriott Theatre, Ryan has music directed "Footloose," "Oliver," "Grease," "Suessical," "All Shook Up," "Hairspray," and "The Light in the Piazza," for which he was nominated a JEFF award for excellence in Chicago theatre.

Ryan is the Music Education coordinator for the National High School Music Institute (NHSMI) and the Director of Education for the International Contemporary Ensemble (ICE), with whom he recently recorded the works of Chinese composer Du Yun. This past Fall he conducted Leonard Bernstein's epic "Mass: A Theatre Piece for Singers, Players, and Dancers" at Northwestern. Nelson received his bachelor's degree in music education from Duquesne University, where he studied conducting with Brady Allred. His master of music and doctor of musical arts degrees in conducting are from the University of North Texas, where he was a student of Eugene Migliaro Corporon.

ANDREW BOYSEN, JR. – SYMPHONIC BAND

Andrew Boysen, Jr. is presently a professor in the music department at the University of New Hampshire, where he conducts the wind symphony and teaches conducting, composition and orchestration. Previously, Boysen served as an assistant professor and Acting Associate Director of Bands at Indiana State University, where he directed the Marching Sycamores, conducted the symphonic band and taught in the music education department. Prior to that appointment, he was the Director of Bands at Cary-Grove (IL) High School and was the music director and conductor of the Deerfield Community Concert Band. He remains active as a guest conductor and clinician, appearing with high school, university and festival ensembles across the United States, Great Britain, and Australia.

Boysen earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in wind conducting at the Eastman School of Music, where he served as conductor of the Eastman Wind Orchestra and assistant conductor of the Eastman Wind Ensemble. He received his Master of Music degree in wind conducting from Northwestern University in 1993 and his Bachelor of Music degree in music education and music composition from the University of Iowa in 1991.

He maintains an active schedule as a composer, receiving commissions from the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library, the Cedar Rapids Metropolitan Orchestra Festival, the Iowa All-State Band, the Rhode Island All-State Band, the Nebraska State Bandmasters Association, and many university and high school concert bands across the United States. Boysen won the International Horn Society Composition Contest in 2000, the University of Iowa Honors Composition Prize in 1991 and has twice won the Claude T. Smith Memorial Band Composition Contest, in 1991 and 1994. Boysen has several published works with the Neil A. Kjos Music Company, Wingert-Jones Music, Masters Music, and C. Alan Publications, including pieces for band, orchestra, clarinet and piano, and brass choir. Recordings of his music appear on the Sony, R-Kal, Mark, St. Olaf and Elf labels.

Paul W. Popiel is Assistant Director of Bands and Associate Director of the Marching Hundred at Indiana University. In this capacity he conducts the Concert Band and teaches courses in conducting, music education, repertoire, and wind band history. Prior to his appointment at IU, Popiel was Associate Director of Bands and Director of the Cowboy Marching Band at Oklahoma State University, where he conducted the Concert Band and the Frontiers New Music Ensemble, supervised student teachers, and taught a variety of courses in music education.

Popiel taught in the public schools of Texas and Michigan. He holds degrees from Truman State University, the University of Notre Dame, and Michigan State University. As a 1996 Rotary International Ambassadorial Scholar, he earned a Postgraduate Diploma in 20th-Century Music at the University of Bristol, England. In 2004 he served as Resident Conductor of the Boston University Tanglewood Institute Wind Ensemble as the Frank L. Battisti Conducting Fellow.
