2009 Arkansas All-State Clinicians

DR. DAVID AABERG – JAZZ SECOND BAND



David Aaberg is Professor of Music and Director of Jazz-Commercial Music at the University of Central Missouri, a position he has held since 1986. He performs on trumpet with numerous groups in the Kansas City area including the Kansas City Jazz Orchestra, the *Boulevard Big Band*, and *Bobby Watson's 18th & Vine Big Band*. A native of the Seattle area, Dr. Aaberg attended Central Washington University (BA and MM in Composition), where he studied composition with Donald White and trumpet with Robert Panerio. He later attended The University of Texas at Austin (DMA in Composition), studying composition with Karl Korte and trumpet with Raymond Crisara. He and his arrangements can be heard on numerous CDs from Kansas City's *Boulevard Big Band* and *Trilogy Big Band*. Many of his compositions and arrangements for jazz ensemble and jazz choir are published by Walrus Music and UNC Jazz Press.

LEE RUCKER – FIRST JAZZ BAND



Lee Rucker has been teaching at UCO since 1981. Mr. Rucker has served since that time as the director of Marching Band, Concert Band, Jazz Ensembles I and II, Music Theatre Pit Orchestras, and many smaller jazz groups. His ensembles have been recognized with numerous awards on the state, regional and national levels for musical excellence. As a performer, Lee has worked with the Woody Herman Orchestra and the Louis Bellson Orchestra as a featured soloist, and he has performed with countless other nationally recognized artists throughout the U.S. and Abroad.

DR. BEN AYLING – MALE CHORUS



Ben Ayling is a lifetime member of American Choral Directors Association and is the choral music education specialist at Case Western Reserve University where his duties include conducting the Case Concert Choir and music education courses for undergraduate, master's and doctoral students. He is sought after as a conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and speaker. He has appeared previously as the guest conductor of the Arkansas All State Men's Chorus and will be the guest conductor of the Georgia All State Men's Chorus in 2010. His speaking engagements have sent him from coast to coast as well as New Zealand, Australia, and Russia. He has served as a clinician at music educator's conferences throughout the United States, Canada, Russia, Great Britain, New Zealand, and Australia. He currently serves as the President-Elect of the Ohio Choral Directors Association. Dr. Ayling's choirs are consistently known for their high standards. His ensembles have toured throughout the Midwest and Eastern United States as well as Belgium and The Netherlands. His choirs have been invited and featured performers at numerous Ohio Music Education Professional Conferences. The Case Concert Choir is the Case Western Reserve University's large auditioned choir.

As a performer, Ben Ayling sang bass in **The Ritz**, a world champion men's quartet that, along with having eight recordings to its credit, performed in 46 states, Canada, Great Britain, New Zealand, Australia and Russia. The quartet also sang on the PBS Special "Keep America Singing" and was a featured group on one of the MENC "World's Largest Concert" broadcasts. He is in demand as a speaker and conductor for music conferences and honor choirs around the world. Dr. Ben Ayling has 17 years to his credit as a studio singer for radio and television commercials. He received his Bachelor and Masters degrees in music education from Bowling Green State University and his Ph. D. in music education from The Ohio State University. He has taught choral music for 20 years in the public schools. While he was in residence at BGSU and OSU, he assisted with each institution's choral, conducting, and music education programs.



AMY ALLIBON – FEMALE CHORUS



Amy Allibon has passionately taught secondary choral music in Texas for twenty years at both the middle school and high school levels. Raised in a musical family that has its roots in Little Rock, she knew she would be a choir director after her experiences in the Texas All State Choir as a high school junior and senior. Choirs under her direction have performed numerous times for the Texas Music Educators Association and for the American Choral Directors Association National Convention in 2001. She has conducted All State Choirs in South Carolina and Arkansas is thrilled to return to Arkansas this year. She is the recipient of the 2002 Haltom High Teacher of the Year Award, 2003 James Whitehead Coca Cola Outstanding Educator Award, 2003 Outstanding Music Alumni from Texas Tech University Award, and the 2008 Score-A-Goal in the Classroom Bayard Friedman Hero Award. Her choirs have won festivals throughout the United States and have toured Italy, England, and Austria. Mrs. Allibon is a frequent conductor of region choirs, clinician for in-service and convention presentations, and adjudicator of contests and festivals.

Mrs. Allibon is the President-Elect of the Texas Choral Directors Association having served as the High School/College Division Vice President from 2003-05. She holds a Bachelor of Music Education from Texas Christian University and a Master in Music Performance/Choral Conducting from Texas Tech. She resides in Fort Worth with her husband of eighteen years, Rob.

DR. ROBERT TAYLOR – MIXED CHORUS



Robert Taylor is Director of Choral Activities at the College of Charleston, the Director of the Charleston Symphony Orchestra Chorus and the CSO Chamber Singers, and the Founding Artistic Director of the Taylor Music Festival and Festival Choir. Dr. Taylor's ensembles have performed throughout the U.S. and Europe, and have been featured in numerous festivals and special concerts, including the 2005 American Choral Directors Association National Convention in Los Angeles, CA., the 2004 American Choral Directors Association Southern Division Convention in Nashville, Tennessee, the 2003 American Guild of Organists Region IV Convention, state ACDA and MENC conferences in Oklahoma and Texas, and annual appearances in Spoleto USA and the Piccolo Spoleto Festival.

Since 2001, Dr. Taylor has served as Artistic Director of the Taylor Music Festival, a summer festival named after and in honor of his deceased father Bob Taylor, an Arkansas high school choral conductor of distinction for over 25 years. Dr. Taylor holds a Doctorate of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting degree from Louisiana State University, a Masters of Music in Vocal Performance from Sam Houston State University, and a Bachelor in Music Education degree from the

University of Central Arkansas.

JACK RANNEY – ORCHESTRA



Jack Ranney taught in Kirksville, Missouri (1961-1963) and in Ottumwa, Iowa (1963-1969) where he served as a public school string teacher and orchestra director. While teaching in Ottumwa, he received the Jaycee's Outstanding Young Educator Award. In 1969 he started teaching in the Cedar Rapids, Iowa school district. In addition to teaching in the school system, he was also a member of the Cedar Rapids Symphony Orchestra. With the symphony, he served as an assistant conductor, director of youth activities, concertmaster, principal second violin and principal viola. For two years, he served as the violist in the symphony string quartet. In addition to his work with the school district, he was also the conductor for the Cedar Rapids and Iowa City Youth Symphonies and the Coe College Orchestra. He was named to the Washington High School Performing Arts Hall of Fame in 1999. In 1980, he accepted a position at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign where he served as the coordinator of string programs for the School of Music, Office of Continuing Education and Public Service in Music. At the University, he taught undergraduate conducting, string classes, and was the conductor of the Illini Symphony. During his tenure with the symphony, the string size of the string section increased to over 100 members. Because of this, a third campus orchestra, known as the Illini Strings, was

created. He continued to serve as conductor of the Philharmonia Orchestra (formerly known as the Illini Symphony) until his retirement in August of 2005.

Ranney currently serves as the conductor of the Parkland College Orchestra in Champaign, Illinois, as well as, the conductor for the Champaign-Urbana Symphony Orchestra Young People's Concerts. He has also served as the Music Director and Conductor for the Quincy, IL Symphony Orchestra; the Central Illinois Youth Symphony in Peoria, and the East Central Illinois Youth Symphony in Urbana-Champaign. He has served as an advisory member of the Board of Directors for the Illinois Council of Orchestras; the past president for both the Iowa and Illinois Chapter of the American String Teachers Association, as well as, the Iowa Chapter of the National School Orchestra Association. In 2000, Illinois ASTA presented Ranney with the Distinguished Service Award. Mr. Ranney has served as an adjudicator or guest conductor for district, regional and All State orchestra festivals in fifteen states, including Hawaii. Ranney received his Bachelor and Masters degrees from Northeast Missouri State University in Kirksville, Missouri, and did advanced violin study with Charles Treger at the University of Iowa. In September of 2005, he retired from the University of Illinois and continues to be active as a guest conductor and string clinician.

2009 Arkansas All-State Clinicians

BILL BRENT – CONCERT BAND

Bill Brent is currently the director of the School of Creative and Performing Arts and Director of Bands at Northwestern State University of Louisiana. During his 26 year tenure at Northwestern, the band program has grown from 48 members to more than 300. With his leadership, School of Creative and Performing Arts has been endowed with more than \$2.5 million in private scholarship funds and more than \$4 million in grants. In addition, all academic programs with the School of CAPA have been accredited by their national accrediting agencies and the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System has designated the School as an "Area of Excellence". Prior to coming to Northwestern, Mr. Brent was the Director of Bands at McCallum High School in Austin, Texas, where the marching band was twice named in the top five in the University Interscholastic League "State Marching Contest" and the symphonic band was named in the top ten in the Texas Music Educators Association "Honor Band" competition. Mr. Brent holds the Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees from the University of Texas, Austin. Among his professional organization memberships are the Louisiana Music Educators Association, Music Educators National Conference, Texas Music Educators Association, the Texas Bandmasters Association and Phi Beta Mu. In 2002, Mr. Brent received the highest honor bestowed by the University to members of the faculty when he was presented with the Northwestern "Distinguished Service Award". In 2007, Mr. Brent was inducted into the Louisiana Music Educators Association "Hall of Fame". He is in constant demand among his colleagues as a clinician, guest conductor and adjudicator in Louisiana and beyond.



RICHARD GOOD – SYMPHONIC BAND

Rick Good was promoted to Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Conducting in 2007. Prior to that promotion he served from 1995 as Marching Band Director and Associate Professor of Low Brass at Auburn University. Under his direction the Auburn University Marching Band received national acclaim. The marching band's membership grew from 275 to 375, the largest marching band in the history of Auburn University, during his tenure as director, and in 2004, the AU Marching Band received the Sudler Trophy Award, the nation's highest and most coveted award for college and university marching bands. In January of 2005, the band was selected by the Presidential Inaugural Committee to attend the Inaugural Parade of George W. Bush. In 2006, the band was selected as one of the top ten marching bands in the country featured at the LSU Hall of Fame Museum entitled "America's Finest University Marching Bands." In addition to success on the marching field, members of Dr. Good's low brass applied studio have earned numerous awards and competitions, including the Blanca Renard Award, the Tamblin Scholarship, and competitions with the International Tuba Euphonium Conference and the Music Teachers National Association. As Director of Bands, Dr. Good's current duties include conducting the Auburn University Symphonic band, the university's top performing instrumental ensemble and the AU Wind Ensemble. He also teaches undergraduate and graduate classes in conducting as well as wind literature. Before coming to Auburn, Dr. Good was the Acting Associate Director of Bands for one year at Arizona State University, where he earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Euphonium Performance. In addition to serving as a graduate teaching assistant at ASU, he was also a teaching assistant at Louisiana State University, where he earned a Master of Music Degree in Wind Conducting. Dr. Good received his Bachelors degree in Music Education from Mansfield University in Pennsylvania. Dr. Good also served on the summer brass and conducting faculty for five years at the prestigious Blue Lake International Fine Arts Camp in Michigan while teaching at Auburn University. Dr. Good has received many honors and awards and holds various memberships in national and international organizations and is active as a freelance musician and an adjudicator throughout the United States, Mexico, Caribbean, and Europe.



RICHARD FLOYD – WIND SYMPHONY

Richard Floyd is presently in his 45th year of active involvement as a conductor, music educator and administrator. He has enjoyed a distinguished career at virtually every level of wind band performance from beginning band programs through high school and university wind ensembles as well as adult community bands. At present Floyd serves as State Director of Music at the University of Texas at Austin where he coordinates all facets of secondary school music competition for some 3500 performing organizations throughout Texas. He also holds the post of Musical Director of the Austin Symphonic Band which is viewed to be one of the premier adult concert bands in America. Prior to his appointment at the University of Texas, Mr. Floyd served on the faculty at the University of South Florida as Professor of Conducting and at Baylor University in Texas where he held the position of Director of Bands for nine years. He began his career as band director at Richardson Junior High School and then become the first director of the award winning J.J. Pearce High School Band in the same city. He also served as Director of Fine Arts for that district for two years before moving to Baylor University in 1972. His musical achievements include performances at numerous state and national conventions and conferences including the 1977 College Band Directors National Association, the 1981 Music Educators National Conference and concerts at the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago in 1989, 1997 and 2007. Other distinguished performances include concerts for the American Bandmasters Association in 1993 and 2006 and the 2004 Western International Band Clinic in Seattle, Washington. Mr. Floyd is a recognized authority on conducting, the art of wind band rehearsing, concert band repertoire, and music advocacy. As such, he has toured extensively throughout the United States, Canada, Australia and Europe as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor including appearances in 40 American states and in 9 other countries. He is a frequent featured clinician for the Texas Music Educators Association, the Texas Bandmasters Association and has presented two conducting and rehearsal technique clinics for the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic. In 2002 he was the single recipient of the prestigious A.A. Harding Award presented by the American School Band Directors Association in recognition of his significant and lasting contributions to the school band movement. Most recently the Texas Bandmasters Association named him Texas Bandmaster of the Year in 2006.
