2001 ALL-STATE CLINICIANS

DR. JACK COOPER, Second All-State Jazz Band Clinician, offers a wide range of experience as a performer, composer, and educator. As a saxophone/woodwind performer and staff arranger, Dr. Cooper served from 1989-1995 with the U. S. Army "Jazz Knights" performing, recording, and touring. As a woodwind doubler, he has performed with Manhattan Transfer, The Temptations, The Lettermen, Sheri Lewis, Kenny Rogers, Bob Newhart and Smokey Robinson as well as many other entertainers. Dr. Cooper has performed with and written music for jazz artists such as Peter Erskine, Marvin Stamm, Bobby Shew, Gary Foster, and Christian McBride. Dr. Cooper has served as a staff arranger and clinician for Warner Brothers Publications since 1992; his music is also published by UNC Jazz Press, ReallyGoodMusic.com, and Three-Two music. Jack Cooper is musical director and founder of the Jazz Orchestra of the Delta, a professional jazz orchestra that performs across the mid-south.

Dr. Cooper is the recipient of ASCAP, NEA, and Meet The Composer Grants. He joined the University of Memphis as a faculty member in 1998 where he conducts the Southern Comfort Jazz Orchestra and teaches jazz improvisation, jazz arranging, jazz pedagogy, and graduate jazz analysis. He has earned a BA and MA in music from California State University, Los Angeles and a DMA in music composition from the University of Texas, Austin. Dr. Cooper is conductor for the NARAS/MEMPHIS Grammy in the Schools High School All-Star Jazz Ensemble. He has adjudicated and conducted honor bands in Tennessee, California, Texas, and Northeastern United States.

VINCE DIMARTINO, First All-State Jazz Band Clinician, is the W. George Matton Professor of Music at Centre College in Danville, Kentucky. One of America's leading trumpet performers and teachers, DiMartino originally joined the college in 1993 as Centre's first distinguished artist-in-residence. He was named to the Matton Professorship in 1996. DiMartino has performed worldwide as a soloist and with artists such as Henry Mancini, Doc Severinsen, Pearl Bailey, Dizzy Gillespie and Dave Brubeck. Widely admired for classical and jazz playing, he has also in recent years begun to specialize in virtuoso cornet solos. DiMartino, along with Centre's George Foreman, founded the New Columbian Brass Band. DiMartino also is a soloist with the New Sousa Band and is a featured soloist with the Advocate Brass Band. DiMartino is a popular performer at the Great American Brass Band Festival, which annually draws 40,000 people to Danville for outstanding brass music.

A graduate of the Eastman School of Music (bachelor's and master's degrees), DiMartino was for some twenty years the Alumni Distinguished Professor of Trumpet at the University of Kentucky. He has performed as a soloist with many symphony orchestras, including those in Cincinnati, Buffalo, Santa Fe, Orlando and Rochester. He is prominently featured in many recordings of the Cincinnati Pops Orchestra. Doc Severinsen commented for a news story: "Vince is not only beloved but highly respected by trumpet players the world over, myself among them. He's a very inspirational person who's used to working with young musicians and he always lights a fire."

BRAD WHITE, All-State Male Chorus Clinician, serves as the Choral Director of Birdville High School, BISD and as an Adjunct Professor of Music Education (Choral Organization and Administration) at Texas Christian University. He is active as a guest lecturer at music education conferences, as a guest conductor of honor choirs, as an author, performer and recording producer. He was co-author of a choral textbook, *Essential Elements for Choir*, published by Hal Leonard Corporation and adopted by the state of Texas and over 20 other states as the state adopted textbook. He co-authored with Dr. Tim Lautsenhiser, "*Choral Directors Advocacy Kit*," a series of public relations and music advocacy letters for choral directors, published by Hal Leonard in July of 2000. Brad White received a Bachelor of Music Education from Texas Christian University, and a Masters of Music Education from Texas Women's University.

Prior to his current teaching positions, White served as choral director at Harwood Junior High, Richland High School, and as an adjunct professor at the University of Texas at Arlington. He has also been active in church music as a conductor, ensemble member and soloist. His professional memberships include the Texas Music Educators Association, the Texas Choral Directors Association, and the American Choral Directors Association. Brad lives in Southlake, Texas with his wife of 15 years, Holly. Holly works in the home as a diamond vendor for a New York jewelry company. They have a 6-year-old son, Taylor, who has just begun first grade.

JO SCURLOCK-DILLARD, All-State Female Chorus Clinician, has taught secondary Choral Music and Theatre Arts for the past twenty-four years in both Texas and California. She attended Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas, where she earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Vocal Performance and Acting and a Master of Arts in Theatre with an emphasis in acting, directing, and producing Musical Theatre, Opera and Children's Theatre. In 1999, Jo was named as the Outstanding Music Alumna for that year at SFASU.

Mrs. Scurlock-Dillard has been teaching in San Antonio's North East Independent School District for the past ten years. Last year, she helped open Ronald Reagan High School, where she serves as the Fine Arts Chairperson and Choral Director. Prior to that, Jo taught at MacArthur High School. While at MacArthur, her choirs gained state-wide and national attention. Her choirs have performed for the Texas Music Educators Association Convention, Southwestern Division of the American Choral Director's Association Convention and in 1999, the MacArthur Women's Chamber Choir performed for the National American Choral Director's Association Convention in Chicago. At the same convention, the MacArthur Concert Chorale served as a demonstration choir for a session presented by Dr. Barbara Baker.

Choirs under Jo's direction are consistent Sweepstakes winners at local contest and have won "Best in Class" at Choral Festivals in Los Angeles, Houston, Nashville, Breckenridge, and Dallas. She has served on Texas' Prescribed Music List and Sightreading committees. She is very active as an adjudicator and clinician. She is married to Rick Dillard, President of American Classic Music Festival.

GRANVILLE OLDHAM, JR, All-State Mixed Choir Clinician, is a choral conductor, clinician, and adjudicator. In addition to his work as a conductor he performs as a gospel vocal soloist. He has performed in Colorado, California, Alabama, Michigan, New Mexico, Florida, North Carolina, Kansas, British Columbia, Texas, and Illinois and at Carnegie Hall as guest soloist with the Alabama Boychoir. He has conducted and presented workshops on Praise and Worship in various states throughout the U.S. as well as in Kenya, Jamaica, and Mexico. Prior to his free-lance work, Granville taught on the faculties of the University of Alabama, San Jose State University, Los Medanos Community College, and Pittsburg High School. He also worked with the Alabama Choir school as the Conductor of the Resident and Touring Girl's Chorus and was the Associate Conductor of the Resident and Touring Boychoir and the Children's Chorus. He currently works with the Los Angeles Children's Chorus in Pasadena, California.

He received an M.A. degree from San Jose State University in conducting, M.A. in special Education and a B.Mus. Ed. degree from the University of the Pacific Conservatory of Music. He is currently enrolled at the University of Southern California Flora L. Thornton School of Music. He is a teaching assistant and conducts the University Chorus. His degree objective is Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Music. Oldham serves as a conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and workshop presenter throughout the nation. The 2000-2001 year will take him to Kansas, British Columbia, California, North Carolina, Georgia, Washington, and Arkansas where he will conduct the Arkansas All-State Mixed Chorus.

CHARLES JONES EVANS, All-State Orchestra Clinician, now in his fifth season as Music Director/Conductor, has established a new standard of excellence for the Long Bay Symphony in its second decade. Critics have praised Evans' conducting as "exuberant," describing him as an "elegant, enraptured performer" (Norfolk, VA) and a "solid and polished conductor" (Little Rock, AR). A champion of twentieth-century music, he has conducted several world premieres in addition to numerous modern concert, dance and operatic works. Maestro Evans has an equally extensive background in the traditional and popular idioms. In addition to performing with major pops artists such as Judy Collins and Maureen McGovern; he has created a wide variety of programs, including highly acclaimed "Rock 'n Roll" and "Gospel" pops concerts for which he has written many of his own orchestral arrangements.

Formerly a timpanist, Evans training also involved studies in piano, violin and voice. His conducting training a fellowship under the eminent American composer/conductor Gunther Schuller, and a fellowship at the Aspen Music Festival. He has also studied under Leonard Slatkin, David Zinman, Boris Goldovsky and David Effron. Evans hold a BM degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music, a MM from Southern Methodist University, and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Eastman School of Music. In addition to his activities with the Long Bay Symphony, Maestro Evans serves as Artist-in-Residence at Coastal Carolina University and as Music Director of the Pine Bluff (AR) Symphony Orchestra.

FRED J. ALLEN, All-State Concert Band Clinician, is Director of Bands at Stephen F. Austin University in Nacogdoches, Texas. In addition to conducting the Wind Ensemble at SFASU, he also teaches conducting and music education classes. He oversees nearly three hundred band students involved in the SFA band program, in three concert groups, the marching and pep bands and several chamber ensembles. Under his direction, the Wind Ensemble at SFA performed at the Texas Music Educators Association Convention in San Antonio in 2000 and 1996. His SFA Wind Ensemble has performed with several guest artists: trumpet Allen Vizzutti, the Resounding Winds Saxophone Quartet, flutist Helen Blackburn, clarinetist Eddie Daniels, and conductors Keith Brion, Frederick Fennell and Kate Tamarkin. Under his leadership the SFA Wind Ensemble continues its long tradition of commissioning new works from composers. Recent commissions have produced works from David Maslanka, Adam Gorb, James Syler and Frank Ticheli.

Allen has conducted All-Region and All-State Bands throughout Texas and the Southwest, where he is also an active concert clinician and adjudicator. He has often served as guest conductor for bands playing at the Midwest Band Convention and the Texas Music Educators Association Convention, and has also conducted the Seoul Wind Ensemble and the Al Fine Concert Band in Taegu, Korea. He remains current in the public school classroom through regular visits to area band classes, from beginners through high school.

JOSEPH P. MISSAL, All-State Symphonic Band Clinician, is Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Oklahoma State University. In this capacity, he conducts the Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, and Chamber Winds and guides all aspects of the OSU Band Program. Dr. Missal also directs the graduate conducting program, teaches undergraduate conducting, and serves as Chairman of the Wind and Percussion Division. He holds a BM in Instrumental Music Education from Michigan State University, a MM in Wind Conducting from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Wind Conducting from the University of Colorado. His ensembles have performed for conventions of the World Association for Symphonic Bands, the College Band Directors National Association, National Band Association, the Sonneck Society, Kappa Kappa Psi/Tau Beta Sigma, Oklahoma Music Educators Association, the Percussive Arts Society, and the Western States Collegiate Wind Band Festival. He has received praise from many composers for his expressive interpretations of their music. Former conducting students now hold high school, college and conducting positions throughout the United States.

He appears as a guest conductor throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, and Israel and his writings appear in several professional journals. In addition to his duties at OSU, he conducts the Tulsa Chamber Winds, a professional ensemble specializing in the *Harmonie* repertoire of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Dr. Missal has also served as a guest conductor at the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic.



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
