RICK CONDIT – McNeese State University - Second Jazz Band

Rick Condit has been an active saxophonist and jazz educator for more than 25 years. He has taught and performed in 26 countries on 5 continents, including as a Selmer clinician. Most recently, he was a Fulbright Senior Scholar at the Universitatea de Arte "George Enescu" in Romania while on leave from his post as Director of Jazz Studies and Associate Professor of Saxophone at McNeese State University in Lake Charles, La. Originally from the San Francisco Bay Area, Condit spent more than 10 years there as a freelance professional.

Condit received his master's degree in jazz studies from the University of North Texas, where he was a graduate teaching fellow and member of the One O'Clock Lab Band. His own group, the Louisiana Jazz 5, has toured France and Central America and performed at the IAJE Conference. In 1998 Condit and guitarist Tom Wolfe toured 5 countries in West Africa as Kennedy Center Jazz Ambassadors, and the following year he was awarded a Louisiana Artist's Fellowship. Under Condit's direction, the McNeese Jazz Ensemble has performed at the Montreux Jazz Festival (Switzerland), Festival Internationale (Nice, France), the IAJE Conference, and in residency at Disney World. He is a Past President of the Louisiana Unit of IAJE, served 10 years as Section Coordinator for Latin America, and currently serves as Region Coordinator for the South Central U.S.

ROCKY WINSLOW – California State University in Chico – First Jazz Band

Rocky Winslow is the Director of Jazz Studies at California State University in Chico. Rocky joined the CSU Chico music faculty in the fall of 2002. The Jazz Studies area since has seen much growth now boasting two big bands and several jazz combos. In addition to receiving all superior ratings at the International Reno Jazz festival this past spring, the X-Press has had the honor of hosting several big-time jazz artists receiving wonderful clinics, and performing concerts for the northern California public. The past two years alone have included Grammy Award singer Terry Richards, Bobby Shew, Jazz Trumpet artist Greg Gisbert and the internationally renowned Jazz Pianist and conductor Mr. Vincent Falcone. In addition to his roles as a popular clinician and well-respected educator, Rocky is also a top call professional trumpet artist himself. He has shared the stage, recorded, and toured with artists such as Maynard Ferguson, Tony Bennett, Vincent Falcone Orchestra, Chaka Khan, Peabo Bryson, Drew Carey, Don Menza Big Band, Natalie Cole, and many others. Rocky's latest CD recordings, "Simple Complications" and "Out Of the Blue" display some of his original compositions and boast some terrific side men including former members of the famed Bill Evans Trio, Eddie Gomez and Elliot Zigmund.

DR. WILLIAM C. POWELL – Auburn University - Male Chorus

William C. Powell, Assistant Professor of Music and Assistant Director of Choral Activities at Auburn University, holds degrees from Alabama State University (B.M.E.), Westminster Choir College (M.M.E.), and Florida State University (Ph.D.). Prior to his current position, he served as Director of Choral Activities at Philander Smith College, Little Rock, Arkansas, for eight years. At Auburn University, Powell conducts the Men's Chorus, Women's Chorus, and the Gospel Choir, and is assistant director of the Concert Choir. In addition to his conducting duties, he teaches both undergraduate and graduate courses in choral techniques, and choral conducting.

As a choral musician, Powell is a frequent adjudicator and clinician. He has conducted choirs throughout the United States including performances at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C., the Crystal Cathedral in Garden Grove, California, and at various choral festivals. A specialist in African-American music, Powell has presented sessions on Negro spirituals and gospel music at regional, national, and international conferences. He currently serves as Chair of the Repertoire and Standards Committee on Ethnic and Multicultural Perspectives for the Southern Division of the American Choral Directors Association, and has held the same position for the Southwestern Division of the American Choral Directors Association, and the Arkansas Choral Directors Association. Powell has served as a music panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts. Additionally, he holds memberships with the American Choral Directors Association, Music Educators National Conference, College Music Society, American Society of Composers and Publishers, and Pi Kappa Lambda Music Honor Society.

DR. LORI HETZEL – University of Kentucky – Women's Choir

Dr. Lori Hetzel is the Associate Director of Choral Activities and professor of Choral Music Education at the University of Kentucky where she conducts the Women's Choir and the a cappella group "Paws and Listen." She also teaches graduate and undergraduate secondary methods courses and undergraduate conducting. In conjunction with the undergraduate choral methods courses, she has pioneered a unique partnership program with a local high school. As a result of this program the choral music education students at the University of Kentucky are receiving "hands on" experience and immediate feedback early in their curriculum. Among her many accomplishments, she was the recipient of the University of Kentucky award "Great Teacher of the Year" in 2000 and has published articles in College Music Symposium and Southeastern Music Education Journal. The UK Women's Choir has been invited to perform at both MENC and ACDA Southern Division Conventions and in 2002 were featured at the ACDA National Convention in New York City.

A native of Wisconsin, Dr. Hetzel received her B.A. degree in Music Education, Summa cum laude, from the University of Wisconsin – Green Bay. She received her M.M. degree from the University of Missouri - Kansas City Conservatory, where she studied conducting with Eph Ehly. Her D.M.A. degree is in Choral Conducting from Michigan State University with Charles K. Smith. An active clinician and guest conductor, Dr. Hetzel has most recently appeared in New York, Montana, Alabama, Virginia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland, Ohio, Wisconsin and Tennessee.

DR. Z. RANDALL STROOPE – University of Nebraska – Mixed Choir Director

Z. Randall Stroope is widely known as a conductor, lecturer and composer. Choral groups under his direction have taken 35 national tours and 14 international tours, including Japan, Russia, Sweden, China, the Baltics, Finland, central Europe, England, Canada and South Africa. He has appeared as a lecturer/guest composer in Australia (Australian/American Fulbright) and ACDA summer conventions in 9 states. Dr. Stroope had performing groups on the 1999 ACDA National Convention in Chicago, and the International Society of Music Education in Pretoria, South Africa in 1998. Most recently, he conducted the University of Nebraska Omaha Concert Choir on the 2004 North Central Regional ACDA Convention. Dr. Stroope has conducted 19 all-state choirs, including the Texas All-State (twice), California and Florida (twice). He conducts the National Honor Choir at Lincoln Center or Carnegie Hall in New York every Spring (Manhattan Productions), as well as a summer music festivals in Canterbury, England and Prague.

Dr. Stroope has conducted the vast majority of the choral orchestral works in the repertory, including the Haydn *Creation*, Brahms *Requiem*, Bloch *Sacred Service*, Poulenc *Gloria*, Schubert *Mass in Eb*, Brahms *Alto Rhapsody*, Mozart *Grand Mass in C minor* and many others. He has conducted the Omaha and Lincoln Symphonies, as well as the Wessex Sinfonia in England, and the Vancouver (British Columbia) Symphony. Dr. Stroope was honored as "Outstanding Choral Director of Nebraska" in 2000. Dr. Stroope is a Professor of Music and Kayser Professor at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, where he serves as Director of Choral Activities and conductor of Concert Choir. He has recorded eleven compact discs - two of his own music, titled *Passages I & II: The Choral Music of Z. Randall Stroope*. His compositions have sold over a million copies.

STEPHEN BULLA – United States “The President’s Own” Marine Band – Concert Band

Stephen Bulla received his degree in arranging and composition from Boston's Berklee College of Music, graduating Magna Cum Laude. Presently Mr. Bulla has entered his third decade as Staff Arranger to "The President's Own" U.S. Marine Band and White House Orchestra. As such he is responsible for the production of music that encompasses many styles and instrumental combinations, most of which are performed for Presidential functions and visiting dignitaries. His musical arrangements have been featured on the PBS television series "In Performance at The White House" and performed by many artists including Sarah Vaughan, The Manhattan Transfer, Mel Torme, Doc Severinsen, Nell Carter, and Larry Gatlin. A career highlight was the opportunity to work directly with film composer John Williams and produce the 'Signature Series' concert band transcriptions of his scores to "Star Wars Main Title" and "Catch Me If You Can" (published as "Escapades for Alto Saxophone and Band").

A variety of freelance commercial projects find Mr. Bulla in the studio producing new recordings, including the popular "Spiritual To The 'Bone" series of jazz trombone ensemble CDs. In 1990 he was awarded the prestigious ADDY Award for best original music/TV spot, and recently he provided the music score for the 'Century of Flight' series on the Discovery Channel. In 1998 he was honored by The Salvation Army in New York for his extensive contribution to their published band and vocal music over the years. This event included a 'Profile' concert of his compositions, featuring performances by the New York Staff Band. Recent activities include a commission from the Library of Congress to complete and orchestrate the last known manuscript march of John Philip Sousa. That music with a recording is now available free from the Library's web site (<http://memory.loc.gov/cocoon/patriotism/loc.natlib.ihas.200000027/>). Stephen Bulla is a member of ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers) and has received that organization's Performance Award annually since 1984.

DR. WILLIAM WAKEFIELD – University of Oklahoma – Symphonic Band

William K. Wakefield is Director of Bands, Ensemble Division Coordinator, and Professor of Music at the University of Oklahoma. His responsibilities include guiding and directing all aspects of the band program, conducting the Wind Symphony and coordinating the doctoral and masters wind conducting programs. Since his appointment in 1985, the OU Wind Symphony has received acclaim for performances of the standard and contemporary band literature while performing for fifteen national and regional conventions of the College Band Directors National Association, American Bandmasters Association, Music Educators National Conference, and the Oklahoma Music Educators Association. Most recently the OU Wind Symphony performed for the 2004 MENC conference in Minneapolis, the 2001 Oklahoma Music Educators Association Conference, the 2000 American Bandmasters Association and CBDNA Southwestern Division conferences. The OU Wind Symphony has cultivated new music through commissions for composers Christian Asplund, Roland Barrett, Carolyn Bremer, Ken Fuchs, Don Grantham, Daron Hagen, David Maslanka, Cindy McTee, Steven Stucky, Dan Welcher, and Charles Rochester Young. The ensemble has a compact disc recording of wind music spanning three centuries with premiere performances of compositions by Cindy McTee and Carolyn Bremer.

Previous positions include Director of Bands at Indiana State University and secondary school positions at Dickinson and Nimitz High Schools in the Houston, Texas, area. He has also served as Music Coordinator for the Oklahoma Arts Institute. Recently he was elected to the American Bandmasters Association and in 1997 Wakefield received the Outstanding Faculty Member Award from The University of Oklahoma College of Fine Arts. Previous awards include Phi Mu Alpha's Orpheus Award for significant contributions to music in America and the Blue Key Society's award for teaching excellence. Wakefield's educational background includes a DMA in Instrumental Conducting from the University of Texas at Austin, an MM in Trombone and teaching certification from the University of Houston, and a BM in Trombone from the Manhattan School of Music in New York City. Additional studies were obtained from three summers at the Aspen Music Festival, the Juilliard School, and the University of North Texas. He is currently National Vice-President for the College Band Directors National Association, Treasurer for the Big 12 Band Directors Association, Past-President of the Big 12 Band Directors Association, and a member of MENC, OMEA, OBA, Phi Beta Mu, and Pi Kappa Lambda.

DR. KATHLEEN A. HORVATH – Case Western Reserve University - Orchestra

Dr. Kathleen A. Horvath, Assistant Professor of String Education and Pedagogy joined the CWRU faculty in 2001. Her duties on campus include: teaching undergraduate and graduate level courses in music education; string pedagogy; supervising student teachers; directing the Case University Circle Orchestra; and serving as the Collegiate MENC advisor. She holds a Bachelor of Music from the Eastman School of Music (Double Bass), a Master of Arts in Performance and String Pedagogy and Doctor of Philosophy in Music Education from The Ohio State University. Her research is primarily focused on the prevention of performance related injuries through correct positioning of the body and the accompanying teaching methodology that facilitates accurate development. This methodology fosters efficient performance technique through muscle memory and movement activities with special emphasis placed on the adolescent child. She has authored several sections in books that specifically deal with string education issues. In demand as a clinician, Horvath has presented at the Midwest Clinic, All Eastern MENC Conference, and National ASTA with NSOA Conferences in New York, Ohio, and Nevada as well as National Biennial MENC Conferences in Kansas City and Nashville. She has been Artist Faculty at the National String Workshop and the American School of Double Bass since 1999. She was recently appointed to serve on the Health Promotions in Schools of Music Committee to assist with the development of teaching materials for the prevention of performance injury as required by NASM affiliated institutions.

Dr. Horvath has over seven years of public school string teaching experience in the states of New York, Massachusetts, Ohio, and Georgia. She has served on the faculties of Southeastern Massachusetts University, Ashland University, University of Illinois, and The Eastman School of Music. Active in her profession, she maintains membership in the Ohio Music Education Association, Ohio String Teachers Association, American String Teachers with the National School Orchestra Association, Music Educators National Conference, College Music Society, Performing Arts Medicine Association, International Society of Bassists, Sigma Alpha Iota, and the College Orchestra Directors Association.
