2003 All-State Clinicians

Galindo Rodriguez – Northwestern State University, Louisiana - All-State Second Jazz Band

GALINDO RODRIGUEZ, Associate Professor of Music at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, Louisiana is currently state president of the International Association of Jazz Educators. Under his direction the University Jazz Orchestra has collaborated with Ellis Marsalis, Byron Stripling, Mike Williams, Astral Project Jazz Quarter, Mike Vax, and Maynard Ferguson Bip Bop Nouveau. He has been featured with the University Symphony Orchestra and the Jazz Orchestra. He earned his Bachelor and Masters degrees in education from the University of North Texas in addition to the Certificate in Performance from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois.

Dr. Ronald Carter – Northern Illinois University – All-State First Jazz Band

RONALD CARTER, one of the most versatile and sought-after clinicians in jazz education, is currently professor of music at Northern Illinois University and serves as coordinator of its jazz studies program and director of the world-renowned NIU Jazz Ensemble. Among his honors and awards are Down Beat magazine's Jazz Educators' Hall of Fame, The Woody Herman Music Award, the 1991 National Distinguished Educator Award, Southern Illinois University's Excellence in Teaching Award, and the St. Louis American Newspaper's Excellence in Teaching Award. Carter's current projects include serving as director of the Gallery 37-South Shore Cultural Center Summer Youth Jazz Ensemble in Chicago, Mid-America Coordinator for the Essentially Ellington Jazz Competition sponsored by Jazz at Lincoln Center in New York, and as a member of the Philadelphia National Jazz Curriculum Project - *Miles 2001*, St. Louis.

Barry Talley – Deer Park Independent School District, Houston – All-State Male Chorus

BARRY TALLEY is the Director of Fine Arts for the Deer Park Independent School District located in the Houston area. He has been the Choral Director at Deer Park High School since 1981. His choirs have recently appeared at the 2003 American Choral Directors Association National Convention in New York City, performing in Carnegie Hall and the historic Riverside Church. He is currently one of the choral textbook authors for the new Hal Leonard Choral series coming out in 2005. He is also the Music Director at the Deer Park United Methodist Church, a position he has held since 1982.

Dr. John H. Dickson – Texas Tech University – All-State Female Chorus

JOHN H. DICKSON is Director of Choral Studies and Chair of the Conducting Division at Texas Tech University. He serves as conductor of the University Choir, Madrigal Singers and the Lubbock Chorale and supervises the D.M.A., Ph.d., and M.M. programs in choral conducting. A frequent clinician for choral festivals in the U. S., Great Britain, and Canada, he also conducts high school all-state choruses. Dr. Dickson holds the D.M.A. degree in choral conducting from The University of Texas at Austin, the M.M. degree in music history and literature from Baylor University, and has done post-doctoral study at Cambridge University, Cambridge, England.

Dr. Jo-Michael Scheibe – University of Miami – All-State Mixed Choir

JO-MICHAEL SCHEIBE, Professor and Program Director, Choral Studies, received B.A. and M.A. degrees from California State University at Long Beach, and a D.M.A. from the University of Southern California. He conducts the University of Miami Chorale. His ensembles have performed with some of the world's greatest singers, including Luciano Pavarotti. Dr. Scheibe is the conductor of the 190 voice Florida Philharmonic Chorus, the chorus for the Florida Philharmonic Orchestra, based in Fort Lauderdale, Florida and serving the tri-county area of South Florida. He serves as an editor for Colla Voce and is the associate publisher for Walton Music, where choral compositions are published in a choral series under his name.

Dr. Robert Baldwin – University of Utah – All-State Orchestra

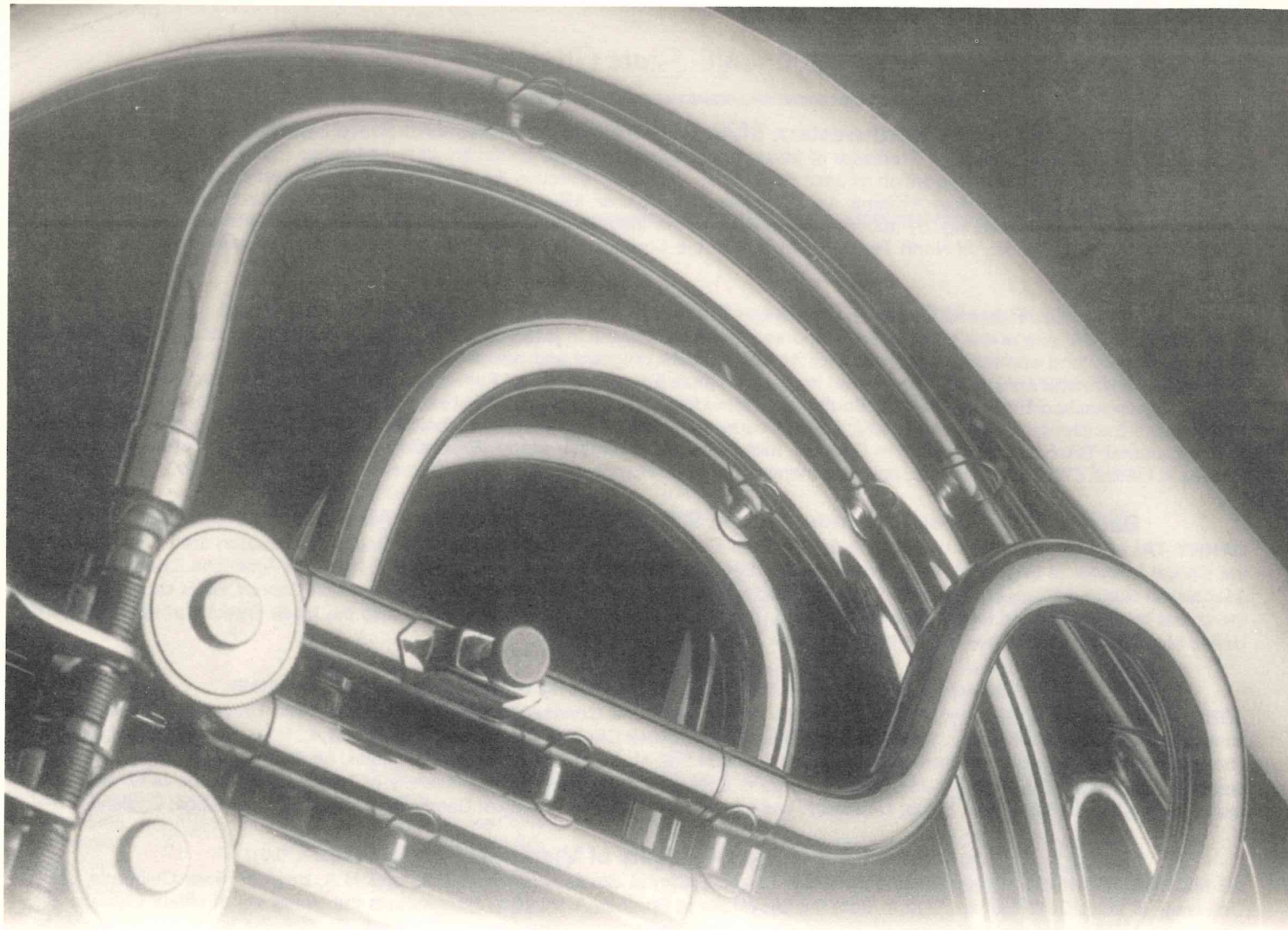
ROBERT BALDWIN is Director of Orchestral Activities at the University of Utah where he conducts the Utah Philharmonia, University of Utah Symphony, Opera Orchestra, and teaches conducting. Dr. Baldwin also conducts the Young People's Concerts for the Lexington Philharmonic Orchestra in Lexington, Kentucky. Also an accomplished violist, Dr. Baldwin has held several positions, including principal viola with the Arkansas Symphony, Flagstaff Symphony, and Arizona Opera Orchestras. He has been published in the American String Teacher, and has appeared on NPR. He has appeared as a soloist with the Flagstaff Symphony, SMU Festival Orchestra, and Sedona Chamber Music Festival, among others, and has played professionally in several orchestras.

Dr. Scott McBride – State University of West Georgia – All-State Concert Band

M. SCOTT MCBRIDE is Chair of the Department of Music, Director of Bands, and Professor of Music at the State University of West Georgia. Before pursuing university teaching, McBride taught instrumental music in the public schools of Ohio. Currently, he conducts the West Georgia Wind Symphony and teaches conducting, orchestration and arranging, and courses in music education. A native of Ohio, McBride attended Kent State University where he earned the Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education and the Master of Music degree in Performance. In 1990 he completed the requirements for the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Music Education from the University of Oklahoma.

Stephen Melillo – Stormworks, NY – All-State Symphonic Band

STEPHEN MELILLO's more than 900 works range from interactive video scores to three symphonies. His scoring work includes 12 feature films and music which has appeared on 28 network television programs. He scored the Academy Award nominated *12:01PM* and the Emmy-nominated *Attract Works*. He implemented the film scoring program at the State University of New York at Purchase and as author of *MIDIMAST*, sponsored by the Ford Foundation, he trained teachers and taught inner-city students mathematics and science concepts via musical composition. Stephen is a many-times recipient of ASCAP Special Awards in Concert Music and has guest conducted and recorded with some of the world's finest ensembles.
